Dear Parish Family,

The summer months move quickly and we find ourselves close to the middle of July already. We know that our annual Celebration of the Feast of the Assumption is merely a month away and much planning and preparation will happen in the next several weeks and has already been happening. Amidst all of this, our scriptures this weekend remind us that as we accomplish our various missions in the Church, our Lord calls us to travel lightly. Jesus sends the Twelve out two by two to continue His ministry, but instructs them to take little with them as they go. Why? It really is all about trusting that God provides and that it really is all God's work not ours.

It is easy for us to rely on the world and worldly possessions and "stuff" to help us get through the day-to-day grind of life. But Jesus is teaching and training the disciples to rely solely on Providence and grace to get them through the day. This will be enough for them. Jesus promises that people will be there to assist them in their needs. God will not abandon them, nor will God abandon us. At the end of our lives, God will not measure our discipleship by what we accomplished or by how many good works or things we accumulate; rather, the Lord will look at how authentically and deeply we loved one another as He loved us.

Our responsibilities sometimes cause us to lose focus on all this. There is so much to get done that we fail to recognize the source of our ability to do anything. It is only through Christ that we accomplish the tasks of our particular vocations in life and live them out to their fullest potential. Yes, there are times when things get busy; yes, there are times when we feel that we will never finish all that is on our "to-do list" for the day or week; however, it is at those moments that we need to pull back a bit, enter into prayer by acknowledging God's presence with us, and allow God's grace to assist us in completing the tasks that really need to get done. If we don't finish everything we want or desire, perhaps those things really weren't necessary and we simply could not see that.

Let's take a lesson from the prophet Amos this week. Amos readily admits that God told him to prophesy to Israel. It wasn't his idea or choice. Amos heeded God's word and was given the ability to carry it out, despite its difficulties and struggles. How much more will grace and the strength of the sacraments assist us in responding to God's call in our lives? Let's not put too much burden on ourselves and remember to travel lightly as we go about the work of being disciples. We need only trust that whatever God wants done through us will be accomplished if we open ourselves to allowing the Spirit to lead and guide us each day.
