My Dear Parish Family,

Do you know the difference between a gathering and an assembly or between a parade and a procession? As members of Holy Parish I certainly hope you know the difference between a parade and a procession! (I haven't known a pastor here who did not bristle when someone referred to the Body of Christ moving through the streets of our neighborhood in August as a "parade.") These differences are very important when it comes to understanding what it is we do, as a community of faith, when we celebrate the holy Mass.

A gathering is as simple as a group of people at the same place, at the same time that even might be doing the same thing together. An assembly, on the other hand, is a group of people who have come together intentionally and consciously united in a common purpose and common goal in mind. A procession is then an assembly on the move with a specific destination and purpose in mind. Participation in a procession is to anticipate the big event that will occur at the destination of this pilgrimage. With this in mind, consider that each Mass contains four processions of various lengths.

First is the entrance procession in which the cross, the candles, the Book of the Gospel and the servers, deacon and priest process up the aisle to the altar. Upon reaching their destination, the great prayer of the Mass begins. The second procession takes place at the Gospel when the Book of the Gospel is processed from the altar to the ambo. The big event at this procession's conclusion is the proclamation of the Good News of Jesus Christ in the Gospel. The third procession is the Offertory procession in which the assembly participates symbolically. When the bread and wine are processed to the altar, the collective joys and sorrows of our lives are brought forth to be transformed by the power of the Holy Spirit into the Body and Blood of our Savior, Jesus Christ. Once this miracle has occurred we all join in our final procession of Communion. We, individual members of the Body of Christ, process to the altar to receive the Body of Christ. That is a powerful witness of an assembly – a people united in purpose and destination - on the move to receive the sacrament of our unity, our nourishment, the bread for our pilgrimage.

We are a sacramental people who use motion with a meaning when we pray. Now you know. And you thought processions only happened at the Feast!

Lent 2016 Report on Persecution of Christians Around the World & Prayer Request

The Vatican says Pope Francis was "shocked and profoundly saddened" by the murder of four Missionaries of Charity and twelve others at a retirement home run by the sisters in Aden, Yemen, on March 4. Gunmen entered the building and went room-to-room, handcuffing victims before shooting them in the head. Medical sources said other victims included four nurses, four security guards and three cleaning staff. Once a cosmopolitan city home to thriving Hindu and Christian communities and one of the world's busiest ports, Aden is now a largely lawless backwater. The Christian population has left. Unknown assailants previously vandalized a Christian cemetery, torched a church and blew up an abandoned Catholic church. Pope Francis said the four nuns were martyrs who "gave their blood for the Church" and concluded by praying, "May Mother Teresa accompany her martyr daughters of charity in heaven, and intercede for peace and sacred respect for human life." 


