My Dear Parish Family,


When one pauses to reflect, one realizes there are cornerstone moments that proved to be very important in one's pilgrimage as a follower of Christ. For me, these moments are often associated with a passage of scripture and one of those passages is today's responsorial psalm, Psalm 16. The refrain we sang together was, "*You are my inheritance, O Lord.*"

Inheritance is a gift that an heir receives through no merit of their own, other than a birthright and then only if so granted by the parent. It goes far beyond spendable assets. A respected family name, a tradition, a sense of security and confidence are the elements of an inheritance that are most valuable. Receiving an inheritance of this type brings certain richness to one's life with a great hope for the future.

In the midst of a retreat many years ago, these words jumped off the page of my Bible as I prayed over them. In my meditation, the Holy Spirit brought to mind the rich *heritage* that had been bestowed upon me in my life. I was the son of two faith-filled, Italian-American parents who went to great lengths to assure that I was reared in the Catholic Faith – the richest and fullest expression of Christ's Church. I grew up in a neighborhood and a parish that provided me with an ethnic identity and sense of belonging to something greater than just myself. I had siblings that loved me and cared for me like I was their offspring. God had already graced my life with numerous faith-role-models including many priests and religious that always pointed me back to Christ. This is to say nothing of the greatest tangible sign of God's love for me – my wife, Anna. In that moment, I was overcome by just how rich was my *heritage* from the Lord.

However, to pray "*You are my inheritance, O Lord,*" is to say something even more radical. It is more than just expressing gratitude for our human heritage that can lead us to Him. Praying this prayer with understanding is saying to our Lord; You are the cornerstone of my faith, You love me like your own child, You point me to the Father and You are the perfect tangible evidence of the Father's love in human history. And what is more, the inheritance He bestows on us is not just a rich life here on earth, but eternal life with Him in heaven. It is a profound thing to proclaim honestly and truly, "*You are my inheritance, O Lord.*"
