Dear Parish Family,

Christ is Risen, Alleluia! The joys of our Easter celebration continue as we conclude the Octave of Easter on this Divine Mercy Sunday. We celebrated well the Lord's Passion and Resurrection during Holy Week and hopefully all were able to encounter Christ in doing so. We thank all those who made these celebrations so special – from the musicians, singers, lectors, servers, decorators, cleaners, ushers and all who participated in the celebrations. We were blessed with good weather for our outdoor Stations of the Cross, which were well attended and hopefully a prayerful experience for all who walked along the way.

As we continue our celebration throughout the Easter Season, let us continue to recognize the Presence of the Risen Christ within our faith community and share that Presence with those we meet and interact with each day. As Jesus told Mary Magdalene and us on Easter Sunday, "do not be afraid" to express our faith in Him. Also, as the apostles began to form a community of faith through the power of the Holy Spirit, we are called to do likewise in our parish. This requires us to support and pray for each other as we journey through the stages of our faith journey.

Those newly baptized and received into the Church during the Easter Vigil have received much support during their process in RCIA. Let us continue our prayers, support and welcome for them during this joyous Easter season and beyond. Next weekend, sixteen children will share at the Lord's Table for the first time in Holy Communion. Let us pray for them and their families as they continue their journeys of faith and become one with Jesus as they receive His Body and Blood. As a parish community, we all have a part to play in passing on the faith to the children of the parish.

The week following First Communion, on May 7 we will celebrate our annual May crowning in the piazza, giving honor to our Blessed Mother who always leads us to her Divine Son. We will also host a parish pot luck that afternoon to celebrate spring and our parish families. We hope you will be able to join us as we continue to build our faith community.

In our gospel today, Thomas refuses to believe the Resurrection until he sees and touches the Risen Jesus – then proclaims Him as "my Lord and my God." While we believe in the Risen Christ without seeing Him, we can encounter Him. We do so most especially in the parish community when we come together in the "breaking of bread" at Mass and when we gather together to celebrate with sincerity of heart. Let us continue to build a faith community that inspires awe in those who experience our faith in the Risen Christ.

Novena to Divine Mercy & Divine Mercy Sunday

The Divine Mercy Novena which began on Good Friday concludes on Divine Mercy Sunday, April 23rd.

Through St. Faustina, our blessed Lord requested that the Sunday after Easter be officially established as the Feast of

Mercy: "On that day the very depths of My tender mercy are open. I will pour out a whole ocean of graces upon those souls who approach the fount of My mercy." (*Diary of St. Faustina*, 699). The Sacraments of Penance and Eucharist are special fountains of mercy which should be received as a condition for obtaining His promise for the Feast of Mercy. Whoever will recite the Chaplet "will receive great mercy at the hour of death...When they say this chaplet in the presence of the dying, I will stand between My Father and the dying person, not as the just Judge but as the Merciful Savior...Even if there were a sinner most hardened, if he were to recite this chaplet only once, he would receive grace from My infinite mercy. I desire to grant unimaginable graces to those souls who trust in My mercy. Through the Chaplet you will obtain everything, if what you ask for is compatible with My will."

(*Diary of St. Faustina*, 687, 1541, 1731)"

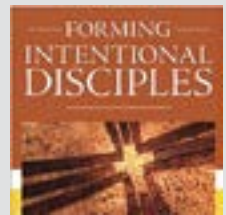
