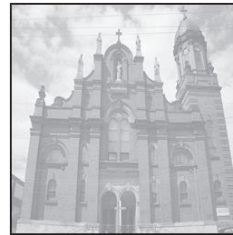

My Dear Parish Family,

I once had a job where the responsibilities of my position seemed to at times, be overwhelming. I would begin each day with a long list of “to-dos” but often due to emails, phone calls and other requests, the list seemed to be longer at the end of a full work day than at the beginning! This made it very difficult to be present to anyone I encountered or tried to help. During this period in my professional life, I found a tee shirt while on vacation that expressed my anxiety very accurately. It read “*I can only make one person happy each day. Today is not your day. Tomorrow doesn’t look good either.*”

Our gospel today seems to put our Lord Jesus in a similar position. Throngs of people are following His every move. They are pressing in on Him from all sides. Everyone “wants a piece” of Jesus. His plate is over full. The faith of Jairus drives him to fight his way to the front and plead with Jesus to come and heal his daughter. Without a word, Jesus responds by accompanying Him, to be present to him and his daughter.

While on the way, another encounter is added to His day – that of the woman with the hemorrhaging. She is desperate for help, but it is not desperation that moves her to touch His cloak, it is faith. Jesus, aware that power has gone out of Him, turns and is fully present to the woman and confirms what she already knows – she has been healed because of her faith. Despite receiving an “email” that the daughter of Jairus has died, Jesus continues on and makes His healing presence known by restoring her to life. Jesus permits only the three disciples and the parents to witness this miracle.

This passage teaches me a simple lesson and confirms another lesson already learned. Clearly, Jesus can make more than one person happy each day. I have a long way to go if I am to reflect His manner of being present to God’s people. Secondly, in the Lord’s final words of today’s gospel, He confirms what I have learned long ago here at Holy Rosary and that is that every religious encounter always seems to end up with a meal – “*give her something to eat.*”

**Holy Rosary Tuition Assistance
2018-2019 School Year**

The Diocese of Cleveland encourages parishes who do not operate a Catholic School to provide assistance for children whose families are registered at that parish to attend a Catholic elementary school. This program subsidizes an amount sufficient to cover the difference between parishioner and nonparishioner tuition rates at area Catholic grade schools and allows families to remain active parishioners of their home parish. Father Michael Wittman Ozanam Center

Holy Rosary is one of fifteen local parishes supporting the Ozanam Center, located on the campus of Saint Philomena Church, on Euclid Avenue in East Cleveland. The center provides food and clothing to clients living in seven nearby zip codes including our own parish's zip code of 44106. Each Saturday, volunteers help pack and distribute groceries, sort and distribute clothing, and provide hospitality assistance.

Clothing Donations: Seasonally appropriate clothing donations are welcome. Please drop off clothing donations in the Holy Rosary Church hall on Sunday mornings between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. DONATIONS WILL BE ACCEPTED THROUGH JULY 27. (NOTE: We do not have extra space for donations until after the Feast in August. Donations will again be accepted beginning on September 1.

Food/Supply Donations: The following items ONLY are accepted by the center: cans of soup, peanut butter, canned fruit, canned chicken, canned tuna, meal-in-a-can (i.e. chili, etc.). Toilet paper, paper towels. Items may be dropped off in the church hall on Sunday mornings between 9:30 a.m. and 12:30 p.m. or at the Parish Office during business hours.
