Pertecost is the celebration of the outpouring of the Holy Spirit upon the Church. The Paschal candle, which has been prominent in Church by the ambo since Holy Saturday, will now stand by the baptismal font.

After the intensity of Lent, Triduum and Easter, we return to Ordinary Time. We begin the Ordinary Time liturgies by celebrating the Feast of the Holy Trinity next Sunday.

Everyday Pentecost: The Church views the mystery of salvation in its entirety. As the fifty days of celebrating Christ's Resurrection comes to a close today, Easter is fulfilled when Jesus breathed on his disciples and said to them, "Receive the Holy Spirit" in the first light of dawn "on the first day of the week." This is the story of God's re-creation, of God's establishing a new spiritual order through Jesus Christ.

The Pentecost is not simply a commemoration of a past event. It is the celebration of a mystery which happened once and for all time, but which also unfolds throughout time. It proclaims the permanence of the Holy Spirit. How else were the disciples to have the power to carry on Jesus' mission in the world? This ministry could only be carried out in and through the Spirit. This Spirit continues to build the Body of Christ, of which we become members by baptism and the Eucharist. Pentecost, then, is not merely a feast we celebrate in red vestments at Mass.

Has the face of the earth been renewed? The Spirit has been poured forth and it works wonders wherever human hearts are open to its promptings. The earth is renewed, each time human distinctions are recognized as merely human expressions of diversity, peace is restored and forgiveness is granted. We are immersed in the vigor of the Spirit of God; all we do is to open ourselves to it and the Kingdom of God is born in our midst.

REFLECTION

The Empowering Spirit

The coming of the Holy Spirit in the Acts of the Apostles portrays a fulfilment of a promise made by Jesus in John 15:26-27; 16:12-15. On a basic level, Jesus not only predicts the future coming of the Spirit but expresses the life of the Trinity when he tells the disciples, "When the Advocate comes whom I will send from the Father, the Spirit of truth that proceeds from the Father, he will testify to me."

Mindful of the call in 1st Corinthians to become One Body, the call for all Christians is to put away the things that gnarl at the flesh and to become one with Christ Jesus. That is the foundation upon which the Church has been built that we also celebrate today. When all come together we "hear them speaking in our own tongues of the mighty acts of God.
