From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

This week and next in our parishes we have the opportunity to look at our ministries and how we are currently serving the Church. When we think about the amount of time we give to our families and all the activities we do, sometimes the Church is seen as extra time or leftover. I would challenge us to move beyond this way of thinking. We have a particular duty to give God our first fruits. We don't go to mass if we have time; we go to mass and then find time for other life events. Likewise, in prioritizing how we use our time and abilities and share our treasure with God, the one hour at mass is a minimalist approach. We should daily be praying and uniting our mind and heart to God. We should stop in at churches we daily drive by to pray before the Blessed Sacrament and order our days around God and His grace for us. In Christian households, it is not uncommon to give 10% of our income in a tithe back to God. Perhaps we are unable to make that kind of sacrifice at this time, but what percent are we giving? I personally strive to give 10% of my personal income back to the parishes and have then allowed God to lead me in where He is calling me to give even more than that to other charities or Church organizations. Giving back to God is a human need that we all share—we have been richly provided for by God—and so need to prioritize our efforts. I am extremely grateful to each of you for what you already do and sacrifice on behalf of the Church. In small parishes many of us work very hard to keep things going smoothly and that is appreciated. However, more of us are being called to serve Christ and His Church in particular ways. We do not please God by simply doing things for Him, but when we give our heart to Him we desire to find ways to serve Him more completely and deliberately. Not everybody has to 'do something' at mass to be doing their part, but we all do need to be giving our heart to the Lord in living worship and allowing Him to call us into a deeper love and service of Him and one another to be doing our part. Likewise, the offerings I make financially to the Lord are not attempting to please God by buying my way into heaven, but the sacrifices we make go a long way in promoting the mission of the Church. Along with the hired staff and our finance councils, I do my best to ensure that we are prudent with our resources and seeking to advance the message of Christ and the Church in our communities. I hope you see this bearing fruit in your own life. May God inspire us to love Him more, to commit to Him more, and to sacrifice our comfort for Him more. God love you and protect you.
