From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

Including this weekend, I have baptized 5 children in our parish cluster in the past week. This is awesome. I love rejoicing with families over their new child and celebrating such a powerful Sacrament of the Church. Sacraments are a real encounter with God and a means for incredible grace. We are blessed to have such meaningful encounters with grace in our lives and I am grateful to be a part of God's action and so many of your lives in this manner. Every Sacrament makes real in our lives a grace that we cannot see. For instance, in all of these five baptisms this week, each of the infants was forgiven of their original and made a child of God. They now absolutely have the capacity to grow in grace and love of God that prior to their baptism they did not have the same ability to live out of this grace. It gave them an invisible reality to live as a child of God in relationship to Him. At every Mass, Jesus is really and truly made present and the Memorial of His Sacrifice accomplished. Every Sacrament gives grace.

Yet, that grace is certainly based on our faith. If we are not ready to receive the grace of God, if we have put obstacles in the way to growing in faith or closed our heart to the movements of grace we will not be able to authentically receive the grace God wants to bestow to our hearts. This is where we must grow in fervor and love of God. We must take more seriously our faith life and prioritize our lives so that God is always first and not sports, academics, or other commitments. Jesus Christ must be the first object of our love and affection. If we receive the Eucharist with this type of faith and confidence in God to come to us through the Sacraments of the Church our hearts will be filled with love, joy, and peace. Let God come to you through the Sacraments as this should be a primary encounter with God and our personal prayer and devotions supplement our life of grace.

I would also like to announce that as we prepare for the next rotation of masses on September 6/7, I will announce officially next weekend that I will not be doing the summer rotation of three masses on Sunday morning next summer. I have decided after discussing with the pastoral councils of our parishes that it makes more sense for the parishes and for me personally to continue with the normal rotation through the summer with masses at 5pm on Saturday evening, and 8 & 10am Sunday morning. I don't think too many people will be sad at losing a 7:30am mass from the rotation in the summer months. Thanks for your understanding.

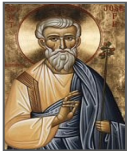
