

From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

On January 22nd our nation will mark the 42nd anniversary of the court decision *Roe vs Wade* that allowed for the legalization of killing a child in the womb. Abortion has now claimed over 56 million lives in our country which comes out to about 1/2 of a generation lost to the scourge of abortion. Rather than calling this generation the millennials or some other name, perhaps the lost generation or the aborted generation would be more fitting. We complain about decreasing enrollments in our area and while these two realities are not directly correlative data the reality is stark. There were approximately 6 million Jews that died in the holocaust and here we are ignoring the severe holocaust of infants dying in the womb in the name of women's rights or convenience. The pain that abortion causes goes well beyond the child's death alone; certainly the mother feels the weight of this and the father the sadness of not protecting his child but allowing him or her to die at the hands of a doctor as if it is a medical procedure. I hope this sadness affects all of us and that you will join the bishops of the United States in praying for the end to abortion in our nation. **Each year January 22nd is marked as a day of penance and prayer for the end to abortion.** I will lead a pro-life rosary after weekday mass on Thursday at St. Teresa to pray for the end to abortion. Please consider joining in our prayers and if you are unable to come to still offer some sacrifice or prayer for the end to abortion. Healing is possible if you have been affected by this painful reality and I would encourage you to look into Rachel's Vineyard (www.rachelsvineyard.org) or the Sisters of Life (www.sistersoflife.org) at 1-866-575-0075 or hopeandhealing@sistersoflife.org. These resources can help those who are hurting post-abortion to recognize that God can and will forgive them and offer them new life and direction.

Update: Thanks for your continued support and energy in supporting youth ministries in our Tri-Parish. At times I have felt like I am pushing youth activities constantly and certainly the planning of activities has been no small task and resource on my time and energy. In many parishes a full or part time youth minister would carry these duties so I am very grateful for the support and encouragement around this and ask for your continued support and patience in my promotion and encouragement to our youth. It is much too easy to overlook the pressures put on our youth and if we do not encourage their growth in faith now, they will almost certainly not look for it in college amidst so many pressures and realities pulling on them.
