

From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

I am deeply convinced of the goodness of God. Over and over again in my life I am reminded of how good God truly is. We have a large field stone at the office/rectory that is engraved on one side with the words “God is good” and on the other “All the time”. I think these parishes remember how frequently Fr. Tim Biren used that phrase and still continues to do so (by the way-he and I spoke and he is doing fine on his time away on sabbatical). However, while this phrase is a good reminder to us, its meaning is not something that should be glossed over. The goodness of God is most fully expressed in Jesus’ saving actions. The goodness of God is revealed most perfectly from the Cross where even in agony Jesus cries out “Father, forgive them”. God is good in that He is loving and merciful. This is why it is essential to seek the mercy of God in the confessional. We should never take for granted the goodness of God that is offered to us through the mercy of God in the sacramental life of the Church. Confession always reminds me of just how good God is as He gives me a fresh start and new beginning. I also experience God’s goodness in my daily prayer life. I know that I do not always open myself up, become vulnerable with, or expose my heart to God, yet He remains patient and consistent as He invites me to a deeper trust and awareness of His love and plan for my life. We can never overstate the goodness of God and the many ways He seeks to reveal Himself to us even if we take our relationship with God for granted or miss His presence in our day to day life.

Good Shepherd Sunday that is celebrated this weekend is a perfect time to remember that God leads us to life-giving pastures and seeks to reveal His plan for our human flourishing not simply limit or restrict us to a fenced in area. The Good Shepherd truly knows what the needs of His sheep are and will always give them what they authentically need. Today let God reveal His goodness and love for you by opening your heart to Him even a little more. Let the Good Shepherd of our souls rescue you from the dangers and toils of this life to show you the pastures of eternal life and eternal prosperity that lie ahead. Come to know that voice that soothes us in times of temptation or trial—a voice that speaks of peace to His people.

On this Good Shepherd Sunday, remember to thank our Shepherd, Fr. Kern, and say a prayer for him that he always has the strength and courage to be a holy priest of God.
