

From the Heart - by Fr. Kern

Come oh Spirit Come. Come Holy Presence of God. Renew us and regenerate our hearts to a more complete trust. A fuller confidence in Your gifts. Send us Your Spirit oh Lord! Next week the Church will already celebrate the Ascension of our Lord into Heaven and the following Sunday as Pentecost where the Holy Spirit, the holiness of God comes down upon the Apostles and we pray upon all believers to be filled with the same Holy Presence—the very Breathe and Love of God. This week on the traditional date of Ascension Thursday (transferred to Sunday) we begin the Novena to the Holy Spirit. I often pray for God to pour out a new Pentecost upon the Church today—to reignite a love for God that is fervent and deliberate. Our modern culture wants to tell us not to be too extreme in our beliefs but the Holy Spirit calls us to be aware that God's presence is always with us and calls us to be uniquely God's in all our actions, thoughts, and undertakings. We become more uniquely who we are and more at peace with ourselves when we allow the Holy Spirit to grant us grace and peace. Our Church is ever in need of God's holiness and love to be more deeply infused—I know I need it! Let's pray for a new Pentecost in these two weeks before the Feast of the Holy Spirit. Let's pray for a fuller outpouring of God's Spirit into our world and for the Presence to be manifest in the way you and I live our lives.

Prayer to the Holy Spirit:

Come Holy Spirit, fill the hearts of your faithful and kindle in them the fire of your love. Send forth your Spirit and they shall be created. And You shall renew the face of the earth.

O, God, who by the light of the Holy Spirit, did instruct the hearts of the faithful, grant that by the same Holy Spirit we may be truly wise and ever enjoy His consolations, Through Christ Our Lord, Amen.

A Blessed Mother's Day to all of you who so faithfully walk with and nurture (or have done so) your children who are a cherished gift from God. Perhaps no figure stands as more cherished to a child than their mother. I pray for grace to carry out your vocation for all mother's on this day. I also pray today for any women who are unable to be mothers because of struggle with infertility, miscarriages, or other difficult situations. You are not forgotten this day—may the Lord in His abundant grace always aid you with the grace of perseverance.
