Who then is this whom even the wind and sea obey? The most difficult teaching in the Catholic Church is to truly believe that God loves us unconditionally. We might try to convince ourselves otherwise about it being a topic like same sex attraction or contraception, but the fact remains that we do not fully believe that God loves us to the extent that Christianity claims. We do not feel worthy of that type of love and so often see ourselves as either too sinful or maybe just self-sufficient and so I don't give His love the acknowledgement it deserves but when we do realize how great His love, we would only want to live in that grace of being beloved sons and daughters in Christ.

Who then is this whom even the wind and sea obey? This is Jesus, the savior. This is Jesus who created us in unity with the Father. This is the very foundation of our existence and gives meaning to our lives. Jesus, help me to believe more fully in the Father's love for me, in your loving mercy, and in consoling presence of the Holy Spirit.

This week we gladly welcome the Totus Tuus team to our Tri-Parish for a faith-filled and fun week for our youth. I hope each of our youth would plan to attend as it truly is a week of growing closer to God and experiencing His love in our lives as well as more deeply understanding the beautiful teachings of the Church. The week provides an atmosphere for our young people to experience an excitement about being Catholic. Thank you to those who will cook a meal, host the men or women team members, and help in any other way to volunteer or assist with the weeks activities! I look forward to a joyful week!

This past week some difficult news was announced as Archbishop Nienstadt and Bishop Piche of the Archdiocese of St. Paul and Minneapolis announced that Pope Francis had accepted their resignations from their duties as bishops in Minnesota. While it is important for us to remember that this is not an admission of guilt of any kind, it is a recognition that the way forward is more convoluted and difficult than might have been imagined previously. Please pray for all involved. These decisions have many residual effects and while our top priority needs to be justice and healing for those affected by abuse these announcements come from men like you and me who have very heavy hearts. Please do keep in your prayers the Archbishop of our region, Bishop Piche, and all those who might take this hard or cause them to lose confidence. My heart is fixed intently on the Lord, waiting for His merciful help. Believe with me in the personal power of Jesus to heal the hearts of men and women of the Church.
