From the Heart by Fr. Jason Kern

This Wednesday we are so blessed to celebrate a penance service for the Tri-Parish. I realize I might be one of the only people on earth who genuinely enjoys confession (I hope I am exaggerating). Legitimately though, I love the surety of being forgiven that happens in the Sacrament. In a similar way that Jesus is always made present for us in the Eucharist, so also in confession, so long as we come with sorrow for sins and authentically confess our sins we are truly and really forgiven. This is incredible. Not only do I then have surety of forgiveness, I also experience the empowering gift of God's grace to live for Him and avoid the things that will lead me to sin. While I recognize the awkward nature or difficulty of having to tell my sins to another, I find it freeing to be able to let go of the part of me that I am not proud of and in fact even most embarrassed about. I no longer have to hold on to the shame and guilt but can literally lay it all down at the feet of Jesus. I encourage you to join us for this Sacrament at our **Tri-Parish Penance Service this Wednesday at St. Teresa at 7pm.**

A week from this **Wednesday on March 9th** we are having a wonderful event where all three parishes will work together to host a **Year of Mercy Family Event**. Please plan to come for supper which will be served throughout the hour 5:30-6:30 that evening. After supper we will head up to the church for a talk by Ben Frost, the director of Youth and Young Adult Ministry for the Diocese of Winona, on how *God desires to bestow His mercy on you*. During the talk, sessions will be available for all youth to participate in from K-8th grades. Upon conclusion of the talk and youth sessions (7:30) we will have a social for young and old and include some discussion on the presentation. Thanks for setting aside this time and bringing your family—it will be a fun night that will help give the final weeks of Lent a deeper meaning and ready us for the Easter mysteries.

Currently our Tri-Parish has members in RCIA preparing for confirmation and entrance into full communion with the Catholic Church. I love making this journey with people and teaching the faith. I had a beautiful experience with a candidate this week where they were not ready to enter the church (yet) but are still searching to understand and grapple with the truth and teaching of the Church. I appreciate this approach and willingness to search for understanding in their faith life. Our Tri-Parish will likely have 4 people enter the Catholic Church around Easter and the Newman Center will have 7 or 8. This is a special time of year for the candidates, please surround them with your prayers.






Adult Faith Formation Opportunities
