

Hello,

It is a pretty low key week around the parishes this week. I know your lives are not low key. School, sports, concerts, practices. Life can get crazy fast.

Part of the reason why there isn't much happening at the parishes this week is because I

will be in Michigan this coming week. I will be leaving Sunday for Detroit. Monday is the annual Desert Classic. It is Sacred Heart Major Seminary's annual fund raiser to raise funds to send the first year theologians to the Holy Land for three and half weeks during May. In 2007, I was blessed enough to make the trip myself. I will be seeing some priest friends there at the seminary, especially at the golf event. Then I will visit some other friends in Michigan and spend the last couple of days with my brother and his family near Chicago. 


