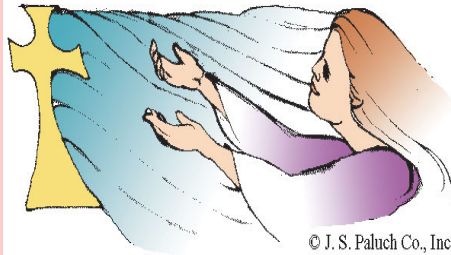

TREASURES FROM OUR TRADITION

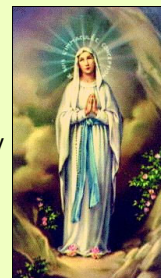
The confessional is a familiar setting in literature and drama. Everyone from Doestoevsky and Shakespeare down the line to Seinfeld has used the sacrament to tragic or comic effect or to reveal aspects of character otherwise hidden. All of this theater, from world classics to slapstick, has had a numbing effect on our own expectations, and has skewed how the culture looks at us and our struggle with sin and forgiveness, hope and healing. Yet the artists are on to something. The reconciliation chapel is a place where hearts are laid bare, where honesty is the watchword, and people confess their deepest needs. It is also a place of rebirth, or at least realignment. It is, like the baptismal font, a place where something dies, and where something else is born. Today, although literature has barely caught up, the place is usually not the dark and gloomy cabinet of old; rather it is a chapel that speaks of peace, serenity, and the comfort of a welcome home. People in one parish were astonished recently to see their children skipping with delight as they left the place of their first confession. We have to wait a bit for world literature to catch up with this reality, but at least we can experience the joy of penance, the thrill of a new beginning, the assurance of God's love.

TRADICIONES DE NUESTRA FE

La Virgen María tiene siglos de estar apareciéndose a los cristianos. Aún antes de que fuese asunta al cielo, ella ya se le había aparecido al apóstol Santiago en Zaragoza, España. Según una antigua leyenda, Santiago llegó a tierra española en el año 40 para predicar el Evangelio. En el siglo XVIII, el Papa Clemente XII declaró el 12 de octubre como su fiesta en memoria de la llegada de los europeos al continente americano.

De María vienen los principios del Día de la Raza.

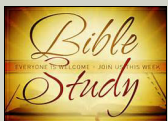


Embark on a Pilgrimage with Mary

Classes for Children's Religious Formation

Public School Catechesis and Evangelization

All Saints is very grateful to our 15 catechists who have volunteered to take God's Word (Catechism) to seven public schools of All Saints Parish these past twelve years. Jesus said: "where two or three are gathered in my name, there I am" – even in the public schools. After almost 50 years of hostility toward faith-based groups, these public schools leaders realize that they don't have all the necessary skills to teach the children. It takes the whole community. All Saints is pleased to join them in teaching these children our Catholic faith traditions. Two other parishes, St. Rose of Lima and Immaculate Conception, have also begun public school outreach. All Saints was requested to begin such programs in three other public schools this fall. However, after two months of "calling" for more volunteers, we failed to find them in our parish. Almost 70% of the Catholic children in Houston do not receive catechism each year. The laborers are too few! Pray that God's grace will help find more laborers for the His vineyard. Could you ask for this grace in your life?

First Confession and Communion Programs begin

On Oct. 19 parents of students preparing for these sacraments will meet in the Parish Hall at 9:15 in English and 11:15 in Spanish. The students will join their parents for the first 30 minutes in the Parish Hall. Any student in second or third grade who completed faith formation last year is eligible to join this program for the celebration of First Communion in April. A second group of students from second through High School will begin after Easter with first communion in July for those who miss this cycle.

Catequesis y Evangelización en las Escuelas Públicas:

La Iglesia de Todos los Santos, se siente profundamente agradecida con nuestros 15 catequistas que como voluntarios han llevado la Palabra de Dios (catecismo), a siete escuelas públicas, representando a la parroquia por los pasados doce años. Jesús dijo: "donde dos o tres se reúnan en mi nombre, yo estaré allí". -aún en las escuelas públicas. Después de casi 50 años de hostilidad hacia fe religiosa, los líderes han reflexionado que ellos no tienen todos los conocimientos necesarios para enseñar a los niños. Eso lo trasmite la comunidad. La Iglesia de Todos los santos se siente complacida a unírseles en la enseñanza, para llegar hasta estos niños que siguen nuestras tradiciones de Fe Católica. Otras dos iglesias, Santa Rosa de Lima e Inmaculada Concepción, han comenzado también a enseñar en las escuelas públicas. Nuestra parroquia estaba tratando de comenzar estos programas en otras tres escuelas públicas este otoño, sin embargo no pudimos comenzar. Después de dos meses de "pedir la ayuda de más voluntarios", no encontramos la ayuda de algunos de ustedes en nuestra parroquia. Cada año, casi 70% de niños Católicos en Houston, no reciben clases de catecismo. ¡Los trabajadores son muy pocos! Recen, para que por la gracia de Dios, encontremos más trabajadores para Su viña. ¿Pueden pedir a Dios para que les conceda esta gracia en su vida?.

Programa para la Primera Confesión y Comunión:

En Octubre 19, los padres de estudiantes preparándose para estos sacramentos, tendrán junta en el Salón Parroquial a las 9:15 AM, en Inglés, ó a las 11:15 AM, en Español. Los estudiantes permanecen los primeros 30 minutos con sus padres en el Salón Parroquial. Cualquier estudiante en segundo o tercer grado, que cumplió el año entero en las clases de formación de la fe, el año pasado, es elegible para registrarse en este programa. La celebración de la Primera Comunión, es en el mes de Abril del 2015. Un segundo grupo de estudiantes desde segundo hasta Preparatorio, comenzará después de la Pascua el mismo programa. Ellos harán el sacramento en el mes de Julio.

San. Luke, el escritor del Evangelio y los Hechos de los Apóstoles, ha sido identificado con 'Luke de San Pablo, el médico querido' (Colossians 4:14). Sabemos pocos otros hechos sobre la vida de Luke de la Escritura y de historiadores de Iglesia tempranos. En nuestro día, sería fácil asumir que alguien que era un doctor era rico, pero los eruditos han sostenido que Luke podría haber nacido un esclavo. Era bastante común para familias para educar a esclavos en la medicina de modo que ellos tuvieran a un médico de familia residente. No sólo tenemos la palabra de Paul, pero Eusebius, Santo Jerome, Irenaeus santo y Caius, un escritor del segundo siglo, todos se refieren a Luke como un médico. Patrón de Médicos y Cirujanos

St. Luke, the writer of the Gospel and the Acts of the Apostles, has been identified with St. Paul's "Luke, the beloved physician" (Colossians 4:14). We know few other facts about Luke's life from Scripture and from early Church historians. In our day, it would be easy to assume that someone who was a doctor was rich, but scholars have argued that Luke might have been born a slave. It was not uncommon for families to educate slaves in medicine so that they would have a resident family physician. Not only do we have Paul's word, but Eusebius, Saint Jerome, Saint Irenaeus and Caius, a second-century writer, all refer to Luke as a physician. Patron of Physicians & Surgeons

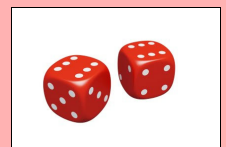
