Statistics show many benefits of attending a Catholic school:

- Catholic school students are more likely to pray daily and attend church more often.
- Students who attend Catholic high schools are approximately twice as likely as students who attend public high schools to graduate from college.
- A child who is African American or Latino is 42 percent more likely to graduate from high school and 2.5 times more likely to graduate from college, if he/she attends Catholic school.
- Catholic school graduates enjoy higher earning potential than public school graduates.
- Catholic school graduates are more civically engaged, more likely to vote, more tolerant of diverse views and more committed to service as adults.
