**Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time**

Serving those in need and providing hospitality is considered an important Christian virtue. The readings of today reveal the unique insight of generosity given in hospitality that finds its fulfillment. Hence the main theme of today’s Mass is hospitality where a person seeks to discover the divine presence in the other.

The First Reading from the book of Genesis is part of the story about Abraham happily welcoming the heavenly visitors. The three unidentified men arrive in front of Abraham’s tent at the hottest time of the day. Immediately on seeing them, Abraham rushes forward to greet the strangers, bows before them, addresses them as “Lord” and, invites them to partake of his hospitality. He gives them water, washes their feet and let them rest in the shade while he offers to prepare a substantial meal for them to eat. What Abraham does is just a normal expression of hospitality to guests observed during his time. The visitors accept his invitation.

In the second reading Paul writes to the Colossian community about his own suffering and the joy with which he accepts them. His appeals to them follow patterns that were familiar in his time and world: his personal experience of suffering, his devotion to the Gentile mission, his hard work and especially his divine commission to preach God’s “mystery”.

In the Gospel passage, we see the true model of hospitality where Jesus is the guest. The house of Mary, Martha and Lazarus seems to have been a place where Jesus was always welcome and where he could find shelter when things were getting too hot in nearby Jerusalem. Luke indicates that Jesus was welcome there as he was a constant visitor and the presence of Lazarus is not mentioned. The incident described concerns the two sisters only.

Our Lord, in today’s gospel, tells us to spend moments of silence before God. Listening to Him like what Mary did. It is in those moments of silence before God that he can speak to us. It is where we can rediscover the value and meaning of our life and work. It is there we can find strength and guidance from him. Yes, we need “a time to be silent,” (Eccl 3:7).

“Mary has chosen the good portion,” (Lk 10:42) Jesus said. Mary’s choice was adoration and prayer. All who follow vocations in the world must embrace the active life of service while still remembering that prayer and communion with God are important too in the active part of Christian life.

The Catechism of the Catholic Church said something about this: “The acts of faith, hope, and charity enjoined by the first commandment are accomplished in prayer. Lifting up the mind toward God is an expression of our adoration of God: prayer of praise and thanksgiving, intercession and petition. Prayer is an indispensable condition for being able to obey God’s commandments. “[We] ought always to pray and not lose heart.”[15] (CCC 2098)

Martha did good things at the wrong moment. There is a time to work and a time to learn and listen. Just like us, we too can be drawn to the danger of too much activity. We work and work as if there is no tomorrow. There is times that our presence and simply giving time to listen are the ones that matter most. We need time to listen to each other to know what hurts and where comforts are needed; to know what gives them joy and where their presence is appreciated; to know their dreams and help them come true.

But above all we should strike the balance between contemplation and action. We both need Martha, the active one, and Mary, the contemplative one, in our lives as Christians. One cannot do without the other. From the presence of God, we go to the presence of people. We come out from the presence of people in order to seek the presence of God. Let the words of Samuel, “Speak Lord, your servant is listening,” (1Sam 3:9) be our guide.
