Fourth Sunday of Easter

54th Annual World Day of Prayer for Vocations

The Fourth Sunday of Easter is generally termed as the Good Shepherd Sunday in our new Catholic liturgical calendar. In recent times this day has also become known as Vocations Sunday, a day on which prayers should be said for vocations to the priesthood and religious life. On this Sunday let us specially remember and pray for our parish seminarians, Levi Schmitt and Daniel Buchal.

The image of God as the shepherd of his people has a long tradition in the history of God's people. The image of the shepherd is one which appears several times in the New Testament. It is one that would be immediately understood by the people of the time.

The title "shepherd" in the Hebrew Bible refers primarily to God, who shepherds His people. This is brought out in Psalm 23: "The Lord is my shepherd" (responsorial psalm). Here God is portrayed as a faithful and good shepherd who leads the flock into well-being and abundance ("green pastures"), and keeps them safe from every danger ("valley of darkness"), so that they want for nothing and fear no evil even as they are surrounded by their foes (wolves and lions). Kings, as God's anointed deputies, were also referred to as shepherds. But some of them only got the title, and not the qualities, of a shepherd. Instead of feeding the sheep entrusted to their care, they fed on them. God raised up prophets like Ezekiel to denounce such shepherds. That is why in our gospel today Jesus gives us the criteria of a true and genuine leadership.

First is dedication. A true leader is ready to give his life for all no matter what. A dedicated leader must possess the so-called **4 C's**. **1) Competent.** Being competent is not only referred to as competence in leading the people, one must also be competent with God. That is having knowledge of God, and for God. **2) Commitment.** Being committed is being generous, that is, donating oneself for the sake of others – a willingness to share of one's Time, Talent and Treasure. **3) Consecration,** which means that as leaders, one is set apart for the service of God. **4) Conversion.** Being converted is being ready to forgive whatever wrongdoings others have done against you.
