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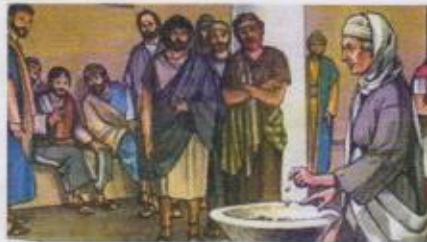

From Pastor's desk: Thirty – Second Sunday in Ordinary Time 2018.

Reflection: Mark 12, 38 – 44: This poor widow put in more than all the others.

Today, the Gospel presents Jesus Christ as the Master, who speaks to us about the detachment which we must live by. In the first place, a detachment of our honor and recognition which, every so often, we are looking for: Beware of being greeted in the marketplace, and occupy the reserved seats in the synagogues and the first places at feasts. In this sense, Jesus prevents us from following the bad example of the scribes. In the second place, detachment of material things. Jesus Christ praises the widow while regretting, at the same time, the deceit of the others: For all of them gave from their plenty, but she gave [the widow] from her poverty and put in everything she had, her very living. He who does not live the detachment of worldly things does live full of his own ego, and is incapable of loving. In such a state of mind there is no "room" for others: neither compassion nor leniency or understanding towards our neighbor. Do I truly live the detachment of the earthly realities? Is my heart empty of things? Can my heart become aware of others' needs? The program of a Christian —the program of Jesus— is a "heart that sees. Let us ask ourselves what sacrifices we can make for our family members, our friends, and our neighbor.

Lord Jesus, you can perceive the dispositions of the human heart. Whether we give from our abundance or from our lack, grant that we might do so with humble and loving hearts.

Del escritorio del Pastor: Trigésimo Segundo Domingo Del Tiempo Ordinario

Reflexión: Marcos 12, 38 - 44: esta pobre viuda puso más que todas las demás. Hoy, el Evangelio presenta a Jesucristo como el Maestro, quien nos habla sobre el desapego que debemos vivir. En primer lugar, un destacamento de nuestro honor y reconocimiento que, de vez en cuando, buscamos: cuidado con ser recibidos en el mercado y ocupar los asientos reservados en las sinagogas y los primeros lugares en las fiestas. En este sentido, Jesús nos impide seguir el mal ejemplo de los escribas. En segundo lugar, el desapego de las cosas materiales. Jesucristo alaba a la viuda mientras lamenta, al mismo tiempo, el engaño de los demás: Para todos ellos dieron de su abundancia, pero ella dio a [la viuda] de su pobreza y puso todo lo que tenía, su propia vida. El que no vive el desapego de las cosas mundanas vive lleno de su propio ego y es incapaz de amar. En tal estado mental no hay "espacio" para los demás: ni compasión ni indulgencia ni comprensión hacia nuestro prójimo. ¿Realmente vivo el desapego de las realidades terrenales? ¿Está mi corazón vacío de cosas? ¿Puede mi corazón tomar conciencia de las necesidades de los demás? El programa de un cristiano —el programa de Jesús— es un "corazón que ve. Preguntémonos qué sacrificios podemos hacer por los miembros de nuestra familia, nuestros amigos y nuestro prójimo.

Señor Jesús, puedes percibir las disposiciones del corazón humano. Ya sea que demos de nuestra abundancia o de nuestra falta, otorgue que podamos hacerlo con corazones humildes y amorosos.
