From Pastor's Desk: THIRD SUNDAY IN ORDINARY TIME

From Pastor's Desk: Fourth Sunday in Ordinary Time 2019.

Reflection: Luke 4, 21 - 30: The people rise up to drive Jesus out of their town.

Expectations have a habit of tripping us up. We think we have it all figured out. We know what to expect. But then something happens to surprise us and we have to decide whether to believe it or not. Is this for real? The folks in Nazareth had expectations of their native son. This "son of Joseph" couldn't possibly be the Anointed One, could he? God has a habit of surprising us, of defying our expectations. Most of us would not be comfortable being called a prophet or considering ourselves an authority for Christ. However, in our Baptism, we were made a member of Christ, and we took on the roles of priest, prophet, and king. As today's prophets, we share the Good News that God is with us, providing healing and sharing in our life. This is the Good News that the fisher men found with Jesus. Sharing this message is prophetic today.

Ever-faithful God, you sent the prophets to guide your people. Give us the courage to be your prophetic voice today. Care for your people in need and show pity on your servants seeking wisdom, patience, and strength.

Reflexión: Lucas 4, 21 - 30: La gente se levanta para expulsar a Jesús de su pueblo.

Pero entonces algo nos sorprende y tenemos que decidir si creerlo o no. ¿Esto es en serio? La gente en Nazaret tenía expectativas de su hijo nativo. Este "hijo de José" no podría ser posiblemente El Ungido, ¿podría? Dios tiene la costumbre de sorprendernos, de desafiar nuestras expectativas. La mayoría de nosotros no nos sentiríamos cómodos siendo llamados profetas o considerándonos una autoridad para Cristo. Sin embargo, en nuestro Bautismo, nos hicieron miembros de Cristo y asumimos los roles de sacerdote, profeta y rey. Como los profetas de hoy, compartimos la Buena Nueva de que Dios está con nosotros, brindando sanidad y compartiendo nuestra vida. Este es el Buenas noticias que los pescadores encontraron con Jesús. Compartir este mensaje es profético hoy.

Dios siempre fiel, enviaste a los profetas para guiar a tu pueblo. Danos el coraje de ser tu voz profética hoy. Cuida a tu gente necesitada y muestra compasión por tus sirvientes que buscan sabiduría, paciencia y fortaleza.
