From the Deacon's Bench

Brothers and Sisters,

Monday was the Feast of St. Mary Magdalene. Except for Mary, the mother of Jesus, few women are more honored in the Bible than Mary Magdalene. But, she could be considered the patron saint of the slandered, since there has been a persistent legend in the Church that she is the unnamed, sinful woman who anointed the feet of Jesus in Luke 7:36-50.

Most Scripture scholars today point out that there is no scriptural basis for confusing the two women. Mary Magdalene, that is, “of Magdala,” was the one from whom Christ cast out “seven demons” (Luke 8:2). This would be an indication, at the worst, of extreme demonic possession or, possibly, severe illness.

In the *New Catholic Commentary*, Father Wilfrid J. Harrington, O.P., writes that “‘seven demons’ does not mean that Mary had lived an immoral life—a conclusion reached only by means of a mistaken identification with the anonymous woman of Luke 7:36.”

Mary Magdalene was one of the many “who were assisting them (Jesus and the Apostles) out of their means.” She was one of those who stood by the cross of Jesus with his mother. And, of all the “official” witnesses who might have been chosen to announce the Resurrection, she was the one to whom that privilege was given. She is known as the “Apostle to the Apostles.”

So, why mention all of this? Well, maybe it's a good reminder to check our facts and not listen to “what everyone says.” Or, maybe it's just a good reminder to say a prayer of thanks for the many strong women who, known and unknown, have strengthened the Church and built up the Kingdom of God. (You're probably sitting with many of them each Sunday...)

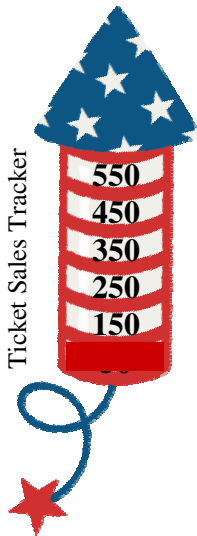

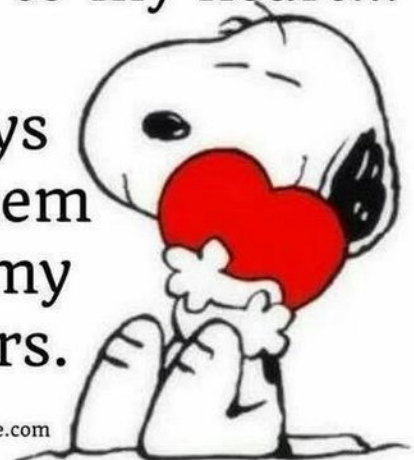
