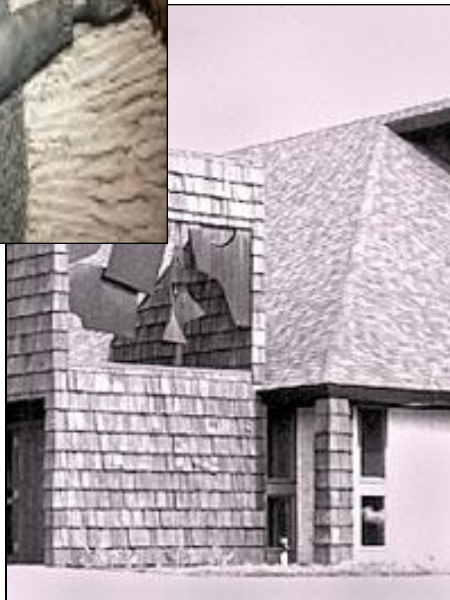

The Bible begins with God at work creating the heavens and the earth. Throughout the Old Testament we have various individuals who are identified with their professions. Moses and David both started on their path to do God's work as shepherds. Ruth harvested grain. The prophet Amos is described as a "herdsman and a dresser of sycamore trees." This role will schedule and oversee the implementation of a preventative maintenance program on all HVAC equipment, including but not limited to, blow-down, belts, filters, chemicals, hoses, piping, drainage and condensate line clean-out, etc.

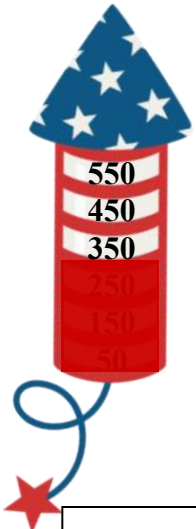

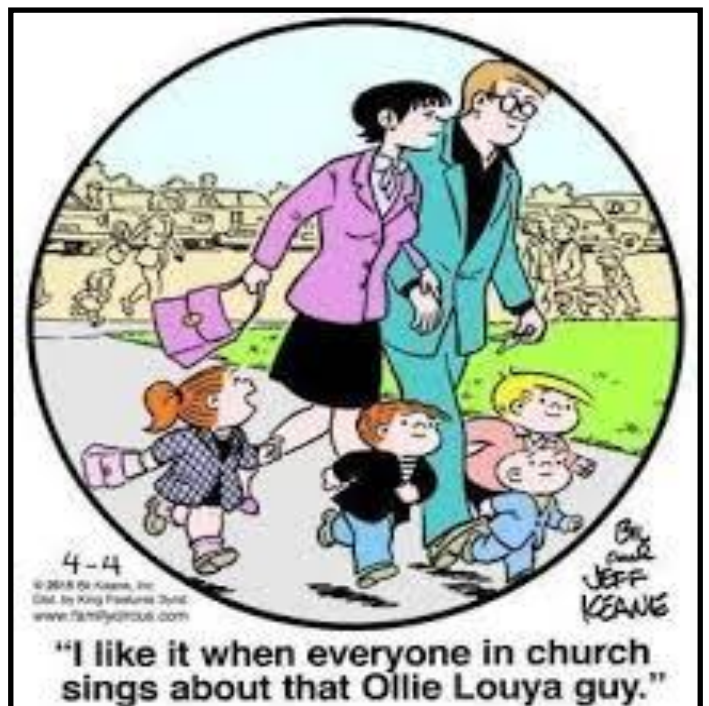
