Dear Family,

Happy Father's Day! Make sure to tell your fathers and grandfathers that you love them and how they have been a blessing in your life. Make sure to try to be specific with a couple of things. This makes it hit home a little more. The mission of a father is to be a "living icon" of God the Father – no pressure to all you dads out there! How can men accomplish such an impossible task? By the grace of God. The Father deeply desires to manifest His qualities in all human fathers. This is accomplished by a pure gift of grace and is the "project of a lifetime." It is our daily response to the grace of God through prayer, reception of the Sacraments, loving Him, loving our neighbor, and carrying out our daily duty that all of us (men and women) experience the transformation from the "old man" into the "new man" in Christ. None of our fathers are perfect. All of them have hurt us in some way. Unfortunately, some of them have hurt us very deeply. Let us pray this week for the grace to forgive them with God's assistance and that they may submit themselves to this transformation that God desires and persevere in His grace. We love you dads! Many, many thanks. For all of those whose fathers have passed away, let us offer our prayers for their eternal repose in the Heart of our Heavenly Father.

Thank you for all of the prayers for me and the seminarians at the Institute for Priestly Formation. My time with them and the retreat was a really fruitful time. Every year I go on retreat I am reminded that it is so essential for me to be able to get quiet for a significant chunk of time, so that the Lord can deepen the conversion of my heart. It was also great to see the seminarians getting such good spiritual formation without having any specific academic duties to tend to as well. IPF is a gift for our Church for sure. Please pray for them and their mission.

As good as it was to go for a little bit it was really great to come back home. The day after I got back I had the opportunity to attend the ordination of three new priests in Lafayette. One of them was a student at LSU and was deeply involved at Christ the King when I did my first stint there. Two other men who were there at the same time were ordained transitional deacons earlier this summer for Lafayette and Houma-Thibodaux. During the ordination rite for priests after the bishop lays hands on the ordinand (one to be ordained), all priests present come forward to lay their hands on the ordinand's head as well. This laying on of the hands comes directly from Scripture as the means the Apostles used to impart the Holy Spirit to those whom they were ordaining to assist them in their priestly ministry, or more accurately Christ's priestly ministry. An ordained priest is by the grace of God – not by his own merit – a sacramental representation of Jesus Christ, the High Priest, Servant of All. I hadn't thought about this in preparing to attend the ordination or even as it progressed until it came time for the priests in front of me to stand and walk into the sanctuary to lay hands on the three men being ordained. At that moment it hit me, "Wow! I am going to get to participate in being and instrument of the Holy Spirit in ordaining this man to the priesthood! This is the same guy who was a college kid when I was at CTK." I had already done this 1-2/3 times a year since 2008 at many other ordinations, but this was the first time that it involved someone who was (continued)

(continued) a parishioner of mine at one point. That was really, really cool to say the least. Really cool. Pray for more men to say yes to the priesthood, especially in the Diocese of Baton Rouge.

This past weekend it hit me for the first time, "Wow, I only have two more weekends at SESJ!" I really haven't let myself think about it too much, because it is still pretty hard to believe. Now that I am writing this, next weekend is my last weekend. There will be a simple reception after all of the Masses for us to say our Thank You's, Good Bye's, or whatever else may be said. Everyone is invited to come.

Fr. Matthew Graham came down last Monday and continued to acclimate himself more and more to the office, parish staff, finance council, and pastoral council. He is really excited to be coming down the bayou. He will also live at St. Anne's rectory as I did. There is just very little privacy in the rectory in Belle Rose now that the office has grown into the dining and breakfast rooms. It will also allow him easy access to a "veteran" pastor in Fr. Paul Gros when there are times for some needed advice on how to handle those perfect and "not-so-perfect" situations that come up in parish life, as well as just some good fraternity and communal prayer. We will be moving back and forth the week of the 27th-30th.

The dates for the fumigation of the powder post beetles at St. Elizabeth have been set for July 11-15th. For the sake of being abundantly cautious we are moving the Sunday 10:45am Mass on July 17th to St. Jules. The entire church building will have to be covered with a tent and the fumigant pumped in. I am sure it will be a sight to see.
