Sixteenth Sunday in Ordinary Time

Brothers and sisters in Christ,

In today's gospel we read about Jesus calling his apostles away to a deserted place to rest with him. As they travelled to this deserted place, the people saw them in their boats and met them at the deserted place. We read that Jesus was moved by these people and their desire to hear him and he decides to preach to them.

Something I want to focus on here is Jesus's call to his apostles to go to the deserted place to rest. This is something that Jesus often did in order to find a quiet place to pray, and his apostles often accompanied him. We can deduct from this that there is some importance to finding a quiet place and a private time for prayer. Not only this, but when the crowds followed Jesus to this deserted place, he began to teach them and his heart was moved by them. We often complain that we can't hear anything from Jesus when we're praying, and this may just be because Jesus doesn't have anything for us to hear right now. But maybe the reason we aren't hearing anything in prayer is because we aren't following him to that deserted place. We have to set aside time to listen to him if we want to hear him.

You can even find deserted places throughout your day. You know that I recently spent about a week in Canada. I went to a place called the Madonna House, which is a community of lay people founded by a woman named Catherine Doherty. She wrote extensively about finding Jesus in the "desert." She mainly meant setting aside time to listen to him in prayer, but she also talked about the other "deserts" where we can find Jesus. One of these was just in our day to day activities. We can listen for the voice of Jesus not just in that set aside time of prayer, but also in between activities, in our school or work commutes, in our chores, in our interactions with family and friends, or even at work. All it takes is to turn your mind towards God, and you can find him in that deserted place.

Please join with me in praying this week that more of us, the St. Elizabeth and St. Jules community, will find moments to meet Jesus in the deserted place and listen to his voice. Let's pray for the grace to pay attention.
