A Stewardship Moment: Pentecost Sunday, Weekend of May 14/15, 2016 – In today’s first reading we encounter the Holy Spirit who at Pentecost came rushing in over Jesus’ followers like a powerful wind. It must have been a frightening experience for them. But their great acts of prophetic witness began when the Spirit drew them out of their “comfort zones.” Jesus said the Holy Spirit, like the wind, blows where it wills; into the lives of good stewards, empowering them to perform wondrous acts of healing, reconciliation and evangelization; encouraging them to proclaim the Gospel with boldness and confidence. All of that is a little beyond the comfort zone where most of us live our lives. This week, reflect on how the Holy Spirit may be calling you out of your personal comfort zone.

EUCCHARISTIC ADORATION – The Bread of Life came down from heaven; behold His Majesty. The Real Presence of Jesus Christ in the Eucharist. There is no greater prayer (outside of Mass) than to come before the Lord in Eucharistic Adoration. Our parish currently has adoration once a month for 8 hours. Is He calling us to more? Is our world in desperate need of peace? Are we in need of conversion from our sins? Do we need to put an end to abortion? Do our families need mercy and forgiveness? We may obtain all these things through prayer and in union with our Eucharistic Lord exposed on the altar. Is He calling us to more? COME LET US ADORE HIM.

The Bishop’s Annual Appeal continues. We have received Pledges of \$23,075 so far. Our goal is \$24,395, so we are getting close to the goal. But, with 72 households out of about 300 having made a pledge, we are far from 100% participation. Money collected over our goal will be returned to St. Luke’s and will be used for our needs. A committee has been formed to consider the use of our BAA refund for an appliance upgrade in the Center kitchen. Please prayerfully consider a gift for this year’s Appeal. If you have not given in the past, we hope you will consider doing so. All gifts are appreciated.
