**Young Adults:** At age 23 you MUST register under your own name! Being a registered member makes it easier to be married, to have an infant baptized, even for a funeral. If you are asked to be a sponsor for Baptism or Confirmation, the parish will be asked to provide confirmation of membership at the Parish and we need to see that you are a registered, active, contributing member of St. Luke's.

**To register at St. Luke Parish,** please pick up a Family Registration form in the church from the table near the side entrance or in the vestibule, stop at the office, or one can be mailed to you upon request. Just fill it out with your information and return it to the parish office. If you are currently a member of another parish in the diocese, the diocese will transfer your membership to St. Luke's.

**Pilgrimage to Our Lady of Consolation Basilica and National Shrine:** A group from St. Luke's will make a pilgrimage to the Shrine on Wednesday, June 22. We will gather in the parking lot at 8:30am to car pool to Carey. Mass is at 11am. We will eat lunch there and make the Stations of the Cross. We should be back to Danville by 5pm. Please call the parish office if you wish to join us for our pilgrimage.

The Holy Door at the Shrine is open to the faithful to access throughout the Year of Mercy. In this Jubilee Year of Mercy, passing through a Holy Door is part of the pilgrimage that all Catholics are encouraged to make, whether during a trip to Rome, a trip to the cathedrals or to specially designated churches in their own diocese. These pilgrimages come with special graces, and they allow each of us to share in the many blessings of the Holy Year. In addition, Pope Francis has announced that Catholics will have the opportunity to obtain a plenary indulgence in the Year of Mercy.

Traditionally, the conditions to receive indulgences are: *Experiencing the Sacrament of Reconciliation; receiving Holy Communion; praying for the Pope; a rejection of all attachment to sin; and a passage through a Holy Door or performing one of the Corporal or Spiritual works of Mercy.*

In today's Gospel Jesus tells his disciples that if they wish to follow him they must deny themselves and take up his cross daily.
