Stewardship Moment: Thirty-first Sunday in Ordinary Time, Weekend of October 29-30, 2016 – The Gospel story of Jesus' encounter with Zacchaeus makes for an ideal stewardship reflection. Church Foundation Report: The repair to the church foundation has been coming along, although there have been several delays. One delay was caused when bats were found in the basement. That required that the places they were coming in be sealed off, both in the basement and the upper part of the church. Then, when the workers got behind the ductwork they discovered that many more supports had been damaged by insects. This meant a delay while more lumber was ordered and also an increase in the cost. The cost as of this time is over \$87,000. The necessity for these repairs is obvious. Fortunately the parish has funds to pay for these repairs, in the operating funds and in the Parish Aid Funds, if needed, thanks to the generous support of our parishioners. The next part of the work entails using temporary supports while removing the 10x12 lumber to install new ones. The company plans to do this in such a way that Saturday & Sunday Masses in the church will not be disrupted.
For the next two weeks, no one will be allowed in the church, Monday through Friday.

ADORATION will begin as soon as the work in church is completed. We are hoping for more people to sign up for an hour to avoid some adorers having to stay for two hours. Please prayerfully consider giving an hour to the Lord. Every minute of the day, every breath we take is a gift from Him. Is one hour of our time too much to ask of us?
