Danville Library Book Discussion – Monday, Nov. 21 at 6pm at St. Luke's

Father Jean Baptist Lamy, who came from the south of France, was the first pastor in Danville, Ohio. He traveled to the newly acquired territory of New Mexico and became the first Archbishop of Santa Fe.

Nearly 40 years after his death, Pulitzer Prize winner Willa Cather fictionalized the intrepid priest as Father Latour in her 1927 novel *Death Comes for the Archbishop*. Cather's Father Latour and his real life counterpart, Lamy, are the subject of a book discussion sponsored by the Danville Public Library on Monday, November 21, in St. Luke's Catholic Church, the very parish that he helped to build.

Leading the book discussion is Danville native Wilford Durbin. Father Homer Blubaugh will also be present to contribute his expertise in the history of the Catholic Church in Danville.
