March for Life Trip to Washington, DC, Jan. 26-28, 2017: The annual March for Life will be held on Friday, January 27 in protest of the Supreme Court's Roe vs. Wade decision that legalized abortion in the United States. The anniversary of Roe vs. Wade is January 22, but due to the inauguration the March is moved to the 27th.

This year will be St. Luke's 18th year traveling to Washington D.C. for the March for Life. The trip is open to all our friends and parishioners. We will be leaving Danville on a Pioneer Trails chartered bus Thursday, January 26 and returning on Saturday, January 28. Our stay in Washington will be at the Hampton Inn, Alexandria, Virginia which is a beautiful remodeled hotel.

While in Washington, we will participate in Mass at the Shrine of the Immaculate Conception on Thursday evening, the 26th, and the March for Life on Friday, January 27. John Durbin, a career courier with the government and a former St. Luke Parishioner, will be our tour guide for any free time we have. Hopefully this trip will be informative and spiritual. Please join us.

Your cost for the trip will be: \$280 each for a double room, and \$240 each for 3-4 persons in a room, with reservations taken on first-come basis. **A \$50.00 deposit per person is due now.** Final payment is due on January 10th. The Christmas mystery (Catechism of the Catholic Church, 525)

Jesus was born in a humble stable, into a poor family. Simple shepherds were the first witnesses to this event. In this poverty heaven's glory was made manifest. The Church never tires of singing the glory of this night:

The Virgin today brings into the world the Eternal and the earth offers a cave to the Inaccessible.

The angels and shepherds praise him and the magi advance with the star,

for you are born for us, Little Child, God eternal!

Why Did the Word Become Flesh?

With the Nicene Creed, we answer by confessing: "For us men and for our salvation he came down from heaven; by the power of the Holy Spirit, he became incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and was made man."

The Word became flesh for us *in order to save us by reconciling us with God*, who "loved us and sent his Son to be the expiation for our sins": "The Father has sent his Son as the Savior of the world," and "he was revealed to take away sins."

The Word became flesh *so that thus we might know God's love*: "In this the love of God was made manifest among us, that God sent his only Son into the world, so that we might live through him." "For God so loved the world that he gave his only Son, that whoever believes in him should not perish but have eternal life."

The Word became flesh to be our model of holiness: "Take my yoke upon you, and learn from me." "I am the way, and the truth, and the life; no one comes to the Father, but by me." On the mountains of the Transfiguration, the Father commands: "Listen to him!" Jesus is the model for the Beatitudes and the norm of the new law: "Love one another as I have loved you." This love implies an effective offering of oneself, after his example.

The Word became flesh to make us "partakers of the divine nature": "For this is why the Word became man, and the Son of God became the Son of man: so that man, by entering into communion with the Word and thus receiving divine sonship, might become a son of God." "For the Son of God became man so that we might become God" "The only-begotten Son of God, wanting to make us sharers in his divinity, assumed our nature, so that he, made man, might make men gods."
