REFLECTIONS ON TODAYS' READINGS:

Isaiah 42:1-4, 6-7: In this reading the author tells us about a peaceful and strong servant upon whom God has put his spirit. He is one who is specially chosen, like Moses and David. He will not stop until he establishes justice on this earth. Jesus Christ is the Messiah promised by God. He came into the world to heal and save us. God wants us to be free from darkness so that we can be a light to others. Let us open our minds and hearts to the light he brings into our lives. Let us ask him to help the Church to be, like him, "a light for the nations."

Acts 10:34-38: Imagine the disciples after Jesus' resurrection. They have such good news to tell about him. He is the Messiah, the One we've been waiting for! In this reading, Peter, almost bursting with the good news, tells the story of Jesus to a man named Cornelius and to people at his house. Peter tells them what happened when Jesus was baptized by John the Baptist. Filled with God's Spirit and power, Jesus did the work of the Messiah: healing, saving, telling people the good news of God's love. Like Peter, we too, have a story to tell about Jesus, our Savior. How can we share this good news?

Mark 1:7-11: In this reading we have the story of Jesus' baptism by John the Baptist in the Jordan River. Even though Jesus was the Messiah and God's beloved Son, he went to John the Baptist to be baptized. As Jesus came out of the water, a voice from heaven declared, "You are my beloved Son." God's approval and blessing was on Jesus. A new beginning and new blessings have come to us in Jesus, God's only Son. When we were baptized, we truly became daughters and sons of God and followers of Jesus. Let us ask Jesus to help us to share his work as God's friends.
