# **REFLECTIONS ON TODAYS' READINGS:**

Acts 3:13-15, 17-19: If you have ever made a serious mistake out of ignorance, you will have some idea how the people in today's reading felt when they heard Peter's speech. It was shortly after Jesus' death and resurrection. Peter wanted them to understand that they had disowned their own Messiah when they insisted that Pilate release Barabbas rather than Jesus. They did not expect a suffering Messiah. So they "put to death the Author of Life." But now they have an opportunity to recognize the truth about Jesus and accept him as the Savior sent by God. Peter urges them to reform their lives and turn back to God.

<u>1 John 2:1-5a:</u> In past ages, it was common for parents and grandparents to write letters of advice and encouragement to their children. Today's reading is from a letter of John to his spiritual children, the Christian community. The letter assures us that even when we sin, Jesus continues to love us. He intercedes for us with the Father. And the Father hears Jesus' prayer because Jesus gave his life as a sacrifice to take away the sins of the world. If we live by John's advice, we will show our love for God by keeping his commandments. We will forgive others as we have been forgiven.

Luke 24:35-48: This reading from Luke's Gospel could be called "The Ghost Story That Wasn't." Two disciples who had just met the risen Jesus on the road are telling their story to the other disciples. Then right in the middle of their story, Jesus appears and says, "Peace be with you." The frightened disciples think they are seeing a ghost. Jesus has to show them his wounds and even eat a piece of fish to prove that he is real. The good news is so good that the disciples find it hard to believe at first. Because they are still not sure what to make of him, Jesus explains how he has fulfilled the Scriptures by his suffering, death and resurrection. In his name, they will go out to preach repentance and forgiveness of sins for all people.

Church Attendance: In the April 16 issue of The Record I saw a surprising poll. The results of the online poll of the question of the week, "Did you attend an Easter service?" was 33% Yes and 67% No. Now I know that this is not a scientific study but on the holiest Sunday of the year it struck me as sad to see such a statistic. It is also why I keep assigning as homework to invite someone to church because there are a lot of people who don't come.

Best Birthday Ever! I can honestly say that I had the best birthday ever this year. I had a surprise party last Saturday after Mass and it was only after Mass that I realized that Amanda Roberts had put "Happy Birthday Fr. Tony" on the outside church sign. Then I had a second surprise party at St. John's this past Wednesday after Mass. I am so grateful to all who planned these events, for all the well wishes, cards, emails, facebook messages, phone calls, cakes and other very generous gifts. I am so blessed to be pastor here at St. Joseph and St. John. You have been too good to me and I thank you.
