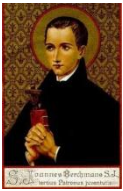


Service Opportunities

Immaculate Conception Catholic Church

ALTAR SERVERS: Every parish is enriched through the dedication and service of altar servers. St. John Berchmans, the patron saint of altar servers, once miraculously appeared (20 miles from here) in Grand Coteau. Children who have made their First Communion may contact Joey or Cynthia Bordelon for more information. St. John Berchmans, pray for us.



ALTAR LINENS: Clara Darbonne purifies the altar cloths, irons them, and mends torn vestments. If you're interested in sewing and washing, please contact her or the office.



ALTAR SOCIETY: Our Altar Society seeks to imitate the Mother of God by serving God and His Church by fostering reverence for the holy House of God. They help with its proper adornment and clean the church with the help of other volunteers. They provide various parish receptions and render assistance to the priest whenever necessary. They occasionally take field trips to learn about the faith. The Altar Society is open to any woman of the parish who wishes to participate.



BAPTISMAL PREPARATION: Fr. Jared and/or Karen Ducote instruct couples on the theology of Baptism and help parents and godparents prepare for the serious commitment of raising their children in the faith.



BEREAVEMENT COMMITTEE: Our Bereavement Committee is divided into different rotations that prepare food and deliver it to the local funeral homes to support our parishioners in the grief process. If you are interested in joining this ministry of comforting families, please contact the office, Clara Darbonne or Annetta Lee.



BOOK CLUB: This is a **wish list ministry**. Father Jared would like to have periodic book clubs in people's homes. The hope would be to have 5 to 7 groups meeting for 5 to 7 sessions and consisting of 5 to 7 people each. Summer time or Advent or Lent are possibilities. Hosts would invite friends and neighbors to join their book club in their home. It's a great way to build church community, include others, and grow in faith. If you're interested in evangelizing in this way, Fr. Jared can provide you with more information (cheap books) and even questions to discuss during the sessions.



CATECHISTS AND AIDES: Catechism, our religious teaching program, is taught to school age children to learn the basics of the faith. Teachers are assigned a grade level and aides are used to assist them. Please contact our director of religious education, Betty Sparks, or the church office if you are interested in helping foster the religious formation of our youth.



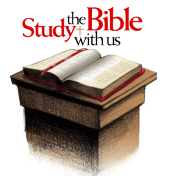

COME, LORD JESUS! *Come, Lord Jesus* is a Catholic Bible study program. The Scripture study portion of the meeting uses readings for the upcoming Sunday Mass. DRE: Our Director of Religious Education, Betty Sparks, has taken on the responsibility of overseeing and coordinating the catechism program for the parish. She makes disciplinary decisions and shapes the catechism policies/curriculum.



EVANGELIZATION COMMITTEE: The Evangelization Committee discusses methods of outreach. We still need a Director of Evangelization and an initiative to reach the un-churched and those who don't regularly attend Mass.



Creative ideas are welcome. Father Jared would like to see the Evangelization Committee implement the book study program and movie program, and invite

EXTRAORDINARY MINISTERS OF HOLY COMMUNION

The Extraordinary Minister's function is to distribute Holy Communion, either within Mass or by taking it to a sick person. In order to serve, you need to be mature in your faith, have received the sacraments of Baptism, Eucharist, and Confirmation. If married, the marriage must be recognized by the Catholic Church. Ministers undergo an instruction/ training with Father Jared or Ethel Landreneau on the dos and don'ts of being a minister of Communion. Contact Father if interested.



HOMEBOUND MINISTRY: Parishioners serve the needs of the shut-ins. We want them to know they are in our prayers and that they are worth visiting. If you know someone who can't make it to church, because of illness, please speak with Fr. Jared or Shirlene "Beansie" Matte to have them added to our homebound list. This is one of those ministries where people often say they received more than they gave. To become a volunteer, speak with Father.



LANDSCAPING: A group of men and women from our parish volunteer their ideas, energy, and tools to keep our campus beautiful. They rotate weeks of watering and weeding. In July 2014 and September 2015 our parish received the Garden of the

MARRIAGE MENTORS: Father prepares couples for marriage through private meetings, but would be open to help from



mentor couples who could offer the practical application of living marriage vows. Toby and Amanda Bertrand attended the training session for "In Home Marriage Prep" and have worked with one engaged couple so far. All involved really enjoyed it. MONEY COUNTERS: Volunteers count the collection each



week and prepare bank statements. Because of diocesan policy this cannot be done by parish staff or the pastor. Confidentiality about individual contributions is a must. We currently have enough dedicated counters.

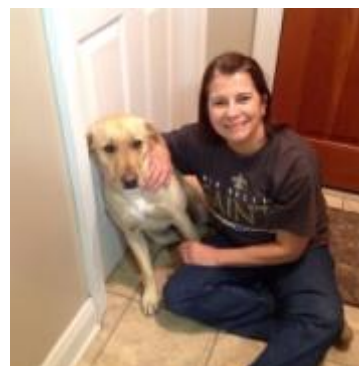

They are ministers and as such should be in good standing with the Catholic Church, weekly recipients of Holy Communion, and if married, be in a marriage recognized by the Catholic Church.



ROSARY GROUPS: Our parish has a number of groups devoted to praying the rosary together weekly. For information on local rosary groups, contact Fr. Jared.



SACRISTANS: The sacristan prepares for liturgical celebrations by arranging the books, setting up for Mass, changing the altar cloths, and making sure the AC/heat are on. They also and pick up the sacred vessels after Mass.

SAFE ENVIRONMENT COORDINATOR: Our Safe Environment



Coordinator works closely with the pastor and Director of Religious Education to ensure that anyone in the parish having regular contact with minors (i.e., anyone under 18 years of age) has completed all required

training and attained necessary clearances. Margaret Lafleur is our Safe Environment Coordinator.

RCIA: The RCIA (Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults) program at Immaculate Conception offers an opportunity to learn more about our Church teachings and prepares adults to celebrate the Sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist.
