Dear Community Members,

This letter comes to you from my home near Philadelphia. In my time here, I have been able to see my sister several times, and I have been able to get together with long-time friends. When I say long-time friends, I mean friends that I've had for several decades. I had a reunion with my college roommates whom I've known since 1970, more than 44 years! I also reunited with several music friends with whom I had the honor of performing, beginning in 1976, almost 40 years. The wonderful thing, well, at least I've found this to be the case is that, when I'm with them, I'm in my 20s again. Such friendships are worth more than gold. I'm sure some of you have had the same experience. I pray that our youth will be able to say the same when they're in their 60s.

To turn to more somber things, we have grave things to bring to mind in the coming week. Sunday afternoon, 18 January, we will commemorate by a demonstration at the capitol, the dreadful Roe vs. Wade decision permitting the horrendous sin of abortion on demand in the United States. The actual date of the decision is this coming Thursday, 22 January when we, as a nation, will observe a national day of penance. How appropriate it is that in this week we celebrate the feasts of no fewer than six heroic martyrs, including the great St. Agnes, who suffered martyrdom for Christ rather than sacrifice to false gods and to keep her precious virginity. Agnes is one of the illustrious few who are mentioned in the Canon of the Mass.

I urge all community members to take part in the local March for Life. There's no reason not to. It's very close and only lasts for a short time. By doing this, we can unite ourselves to millions of others who either march locally where they live or who descend upon Washington DC. We can spit on the devil and his angels – who, in Sacred Scripture, called themselves 'Legion'. We, without much labor, can come together the form a far more powerful 'Legion' by marching for Christ and all of those poor little ones sacrificed for the fatuous reasons of "convenience" or "concern for the quality of life." What rot, I hope you'll agree, my children and my friends.
