Dear Community Members,

This Sunday begins the season of Septuagesima. Sunday vestments are violet. The Alleluia, both in the Divine Office and at Mass, is no longer said or sung. The Alleluia verse is replaced by the Tract. In addition, this Monday, 2 February, is The Feast of Candlemas aka The Purification of the Blessed Virgin Mary. We will have two Mass that day, the normal 7:15 AM Mass and also a Sung Mass at 7:00 PM. I will bless candles to be used in the liturgy at the 7:00 PM Mass. Your candles, if you bring some, will be blessed at the Mass which you attend. Of course, the traditional procession will precede the evening Sung Mass.

Tuesday is The Feast of St. Blaise. Throats are blessed on this day. Since many of you will be unable to attend Mass on Tuesday, I will bless throats following each Sunday Mass. Of course, I will bless throats again on St. Blaise's actual feast day.

This Sunday will also be your last opportunity to take Epiphany Water home with you. I will use the surplus to fill the large Holy Water container in the vestibule and the rest I will either pour into the sacrarium or water trees and flowers outside the church.

While in Rome, I secured a Papal Blessing for our community. It took a while to get framed, but the beautiful scroll is now displayed in the vestibule across from our notice board. There was really no other place to display it. I also acquired a small tapestry of St. John the Baptist. I plan either to suspend it from the pulpit during our Masses or, perhaps, have a banner made with the tapestry as the center piece.

The season of Septuagesima is a kind of preparation for the Holy Season of Lent. During these weeks preceding Ash Wednesday, we will have a chance to "ease" ourselves into our full-fledged Lenten mortifications. This would also be a good time to make some Lenten resolutions. What might these be? Well, perhaps a resolution to receive the Sacrament of Penance more often than we normally do, make a greater effort to attend Daily Mass, or spend some time reading the Bible or works from the Church Fathers. Just a few suggestions, my children and my friends.
