Dear Community Members,

This Sunday is the last in our “pre-Lent” prep-time. This coming Wednesday is Ash Wednesday. In order to enable as many people as possible to receive ashes, I will celebrate three Ash Wednesday Masses, one at 6:30 AM, one at Noon and a Sung Mass at 7:00 PM. Of course, St. Patrick has an 8:00 AM Mass in its normal Wednesday schedule, if that is more convenient for you.

Our Sunday Pot-Luck Annual Chili Cook-Off was a great success. First place went to Philip Carr. For second place, there was a four-way tie: Anna Sonnier, Catherine Bulmanski, Michele McCann and Shanela Cavin. Third place went to Lori Sonnier. It was a great, fun afternoon. Lots of kids, play (the annual piñata), socializing and good food. In short, about as Catholic as you can get.

You’ll remember I spoke about the annual CASA (Catholic Arkansas Sharing Appeal) last Sunday. Last year, our goal was \$2,992.50. Last year, we contributed \$4,105.00, a whopping 274% of our goal. A heartfelt “thank you” to all who contributed and ensured that the bishop sat up and took notice. This amount was contributed by only nine members of the community. Bravi, tutti! It is our time to prepare to enjoy the Fruit of His Ministry, namely His Sacrificial Death which paid for our sins, and His Glorious Resurrection which ensures our time with Him in Eternity, if we but follow His Law. As you know, Ash Wednesday and Good Friday (at the minimum) are days of fast and abstinence. All Fridays are days of abstinence.

Let’s all use this coming Lent to our best advantage, my children and my friends.
