Dear Community Members,

Greetings from Denton, Nebraska. I am into the third day of my yearly retreat. This is a silent retreat so you all probably know how this week might be one of my more difficult weeks of 2015. All priests and religious, except for contemplatives, I imagine, are required to go on retreat for one week per year. I'm not required to make my retreat either with other FSSP priests or at the seminary, but since this is more or less a Fraternity tradition, I now make it mine. Still, one of these years I would like to make my retreat at, say, Clear Creek or with the Carmelites in Wyoming.

In past years, my retreat experiences were somewhat varied. While at the FSSP apostolate in Scranton, I went to the Benedictine nuns when they were in Shohola, PA. These are the sisters who are now in the diocese of Kansas City-St. Joseph. When I was in Indiana, I went on retreat to St. Meinrad Archabbey and to the Friars of the Immaculate in Bloomington. It was there that I met Cardinal Burke for the first time. He was our retreat master. Last year in Nebraska, none other than Bishop Athanasius Schneider was our retreat master. Funny, this year I have no idea who it is.

Well, Father Orłowski has been with us for more than a week now. He seems to be settling in nicely. Things certainly look different on the second floor of the rectory now. Father brought a bit of furniture with him. One of the things he brought – which I should certainly make use of – is an “elliptical.” Father celebrated the 7AM Mass last Sunday and all of the Masses up through Saturday of this week while I'm on retreat. Father and I will most probably alternate Masses on Sunday and on those days when two Masses are scheduled. He'll now be the primary celebrant for the Missionaries of Charity Masses as well.

As I explained before, Father Orłowski is compensated by FSSP Headquarters. It is also from HQ that he receives his Mass intentions and stipends. When he celebrates Masses for the community, however, be it on a weekday or Sunday, he will celebrate that Mass for the stated community intention and receive the stipend from me. There will be no change in the procedure for Mass intentions or stipends. We like to keep things easy and consistent, don't we?

I look forward to seeing you this weekend, my children and my friends.
