Dear Community Members,

Father Orłowski suggested I write the letter this week. He thought you might need the break. Not so, I thought. I'm sure you found his letters quite interesting and insightful. I surely did. I must say, I am very glad Father is with us and I know you are too.

I must admit that I was a tiny bit apprehensive at first. You can imagine that, at times, it's a little awkward for two grown men, who really never knew each other very well, to start living under the same roof. After all, I've lived alone for nine out of 10 years of my priestly life – and for most of my adult life before that. I served in Scranton as Fr. Gismondi's assistant, but after that, even though I was associate pastor and administrator in Indianapolis, for all intents and purposes, I lived alone.

I lived in the cathedral rectory for my first five years there. I had my own suite and use of the common areas. But, sometimes, I went for days without seeing any of the priests that lived in that rectory. We all had different schedules and, in effect, different "lives." I lived in my own apartment within the parish complex for my last two years – again, a former convent. But it certainly wasn't nearly as nice as the place I live in now.

In the beginning, Father Orłowski and I bungled through life together, trying not to step on each other's toes. Sometimes, it seems that men have to go through this clumsy kind of "dance." We had to get used to each other. As the "superior" of the house, there were times I thought that Fr. Orłowski should learn to read my mind a bit better, but then I realized that I had to get over that and that we just simply had to talk about things, sometimes even silly things or past lives or childhoods, and just try to get to know each other better. We have and life with him is good. We laugh more and we don't (read I, i.e., me) take ourselves too seriously any more.

Thank you for understanding about Father's and my absence last week. Father and I are still quite sad about losing our very good friend, Patti Bammel. I ask you all to keep her husband, Brian, in your prayers. He's a good man and quite lost at the moment.

Father Orłowski will be writing to you again next week. I imagine he'll tie the strings of his life and vocation together and you should all have a wonderful picture and even feel that you know, a bit more, the man and the priest who is my assistant, my friend and your co-pastor. He's a good, holy, very friendly (you should see him "holding court" when we do our weekly shopping at Kroger) yet very approachable and down to earth man. I believe he's a perfect fit and I hope he's with us a good, long time.

We'll be adding something to our regular First Saturday Mass and St. Monica devotion. Prior to Mass, there will be the public recitation of the Most Holy Rosary. Quite frankly, this is something I've fretted about for a while here. I intend to give the Rosary quite a big kick-start again, i.e., recitation prior to each Sunday Mass. Truly, I've never seen a "traditional" congregation that DOESN'T pray the Rosary before Mass. We've got to get our act together here.

Soon, I'll be leaving for my yearly Florida vacation. More about that later, my children and my friends.
