Fall is rapidly approaching. I struck me Tuesday morning that it's now relatively dark at 5:30 AM. I must say, I consider that quite good. I, for one, get tired of bright sun streaming in through my window at those early hours. Sometimes the sun has awakened me before my alarm clock goes off. Now, there's not so much competition between the two.

Soon we will mark the autumnal equinox, which occurs this year on 23 September, the formal beginning of Fall 2015. This year the Fall Ember Days line up just right. Ember Wednesday is 23 September. Our farewell to Summer is the Feast of St. Thomas of Villanova.

Well, I'm now home more than a week and I've gotten back into the swing of things. I even "celebrated" the first day of dove season, this year for the second time since I arrived. Last year, I bagged one. This year, nothing, I'm embarrassed to say.

This month, in addition to the Feast of Our Lady's Nativity on the 8th, there are two very important days in our liturgical calendar. The first is the Exaltation of the Holy Cross on the 14th and the Feast of St. Michael the Archangel on the 29th.
