Dear Community Members,

Gosh! Here we go again. Why doesn't time ever slow down instead of speed up. Regardless of whether you read this Wednesday evening, 4/6 or Sunday, 4/10 it's already two weeks into the Easter Season.

Last weekend was a great treat for us, I'm sure you'll agree. We were actually able to have a Solemn Mass on Divine Mercy Sunday! Usually, such liturgical banquets are reserved to Holy Week or, on very rare occasions, a First Class Feast here or there. Not only was our Low Sunday Mass solemn, but we had one of our own as the deacon, Rev. Mr. Edward Brodsky.

Both Father Orłowski agreed that last Sunday's Solemn Mass was the easiest, breeziest Solemn Masses we had experienced in several years. We both knew that Deacon Brodsky would do his part to perfection. And that he did indeed. This also speaks very well of our excellent server corps. They all performed quite admirably. They certainly know Solemn Mass very well now. Perhaps future rehearsals will be shorter and less frequent – at least as far as Solemn Masses go, anyway.

I'd like to take this opportunity to remind you that Deacon Brodsky will be back with us on Sunday, 12 June. He will be honoring us with one of his "first" Masses. Baby priests can get away with several "first" big Masses following ordination. I only had one, but it was huge, I tell you. One was enough. Anyway, back on track. As it happens, 12 June is our normal second Sunday brunch day. But this will be special in that it will also serve as Father Brodsky's reception.

Every so often we experience Sundays that have special names. Last Sunday had no fewer than five: "Low" Sunday, Divine Mercy Sunday, The Octave of Easter, *Dominica in Albis* and "Quasimodo" Sunday. This Sunday is traditionally known as Good Shepherd Sunday.

April, apart from the transferred Feast of the Annunciation last Monday, is a rather calm month for us. But, get ready. May and June will be anything but calm. May 29 is the External Solemnity of Corpus Christi with First Communion and Procession. Think ahead to June when, once again, Graf Ernst und Gräfin Shanela von Cavin will host our Patronal Feast at their estate on 24 June. Such a wonderful, full liturgical life we have here, my children and my friends.
