Dear Community Members,

This will be my last bulletin letter to you. I imagined that I'd be writing this around the end of June 2019, but God, prompting my superiors, obviously had other plans. Please know that I will miss you very much, especially those to whom I have grown rather close. I will remember you in my prayers and at Mass. I have had some very happy times here, well, at least my first two years. The one thing I absolutely will NOT miss is the heat, humidity and summer doldrums.

We welcome Father John Berg, Superior General of the FSSP. Many of you read the bulletin as soon as it's posted on the website, usually Wednesday. That means you'll be reading this before Fr. Berg lands. He (will have) landed Saturday evening. I have asked him to preach. That is most appropriate, of course. His visit is a "canonical" visit, to be sure, but it's not the "normal" kind of canonical visit. This time, he's here more to speak to you than to me or Father Orłowski. It is very important that all of you plan to attend the community meeting after the 11:30 am Mass, over in the North Little Rock Funeral Home chapel.

It's fortunate that the 11:30 am Mass is a Solemn Mass. I was worried that we wouldn't have enough servers, since one of our primary server families has urgent business out of state. But, God smiled on us and we will have enough for a Solemn Mass crew.

I have no idea how long our Sunday meeting will go. I do know that we will have to adjust to a new environment for the duration of the meeting. Unlike the parish center gym, the funeral home chapel is not a place for kids to run and play. There will be rest room facilities, of course, but I hope that you will make every effort to use the facilities in the church rather than in the funeral home. There will be no food or beverages permitted in the funeral home chapel. That means no Cheerios for hungry toddlers. The plan is that small children and toddlers remain either in front of the church/rectory or inside the rectory if the weather is chilly or rainy. Of course, there will be careful supervision. Nothing to worry about on that score.

This will be a meeting where you will be able to ask questions and speak your mind. So, it's not just Fr. Berg who will be able to speak. I do know that my transfer is a "done deal," so no requests for me to stay should be made. Some of y'all might be glad I'm leaving, heh, heh. Fr. Berg will meet with Bishop Taylor Monday, 28 November, and will then depart for his next destination.

Father Orłowski will assume command of the apostolate as Chaplain pro tem. I know that you will treat him kindly. This is my last Sunday with you. It's unlikely that we'll see one another again. Pray that we all meet again "in patria." I am a better priest for having been here with you, my children and my friends.
