**Proper for Today’s Mass:** The texts proper to today’s Mass begin on page 37 in the *St. Edmund Campion Missal & Hymnal*.

**Tuesday, January 1, the Octave Day of the Nativity** is a Holyday of Obligation. Masses will be according to a Sunday schedule.

**Epiphany House Blessing:** In the Church’s traditional liturgical books, there is a “Blessing for a House on the Feast of the Epiphany.” The ceremony consists in the recitation of an antiphon for the Epiphany, followed by Our Lady’s *Magnificat*, during which the house is sprinkled with Epiphany Holy Water and is incensed, followed by a prayer and blessing by the priest. Anyone wishing to receive this blessing for his dwelling-place, please sign up on the list in the vestibule. Fathers McCambridge and Braun will divide up the visits between January 6<sup>th</sup> and 13<sup>th</sup>.

**Display of Sacred Relics:** St. Joseph in Conway (and other parishes) will host Fr. Carlos Martins (of the Companions of the Cross), for the display a Vatican collection of more than 150 relics, some as old as 2,000 years. Among them will be relics of St. Maria Goretti, St. Therese of Lisieux, St. Francis of Assisi, St. Anthony of Padua, St. Thomas Aquinas and St. Faustina Kowalska. There will also be present a portion of Our Lady's veil, as well as one of the largest remaining pieces of the True Cross in the world. The faithful will be able to examine and venerate each relic. In the Church's history, many miracles and healings have been worked in the presence of relics, and many have been healed through this ministry. Please do not miss this opportunity. You are encouraged to bring your articles of devotion (such as rosaries, holy cards, etc.) and pictures of ill friends/family members, which you will be able to touch to the reliquaries as a means of intercession.
