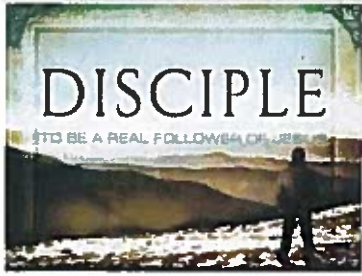
Seminarian Collection

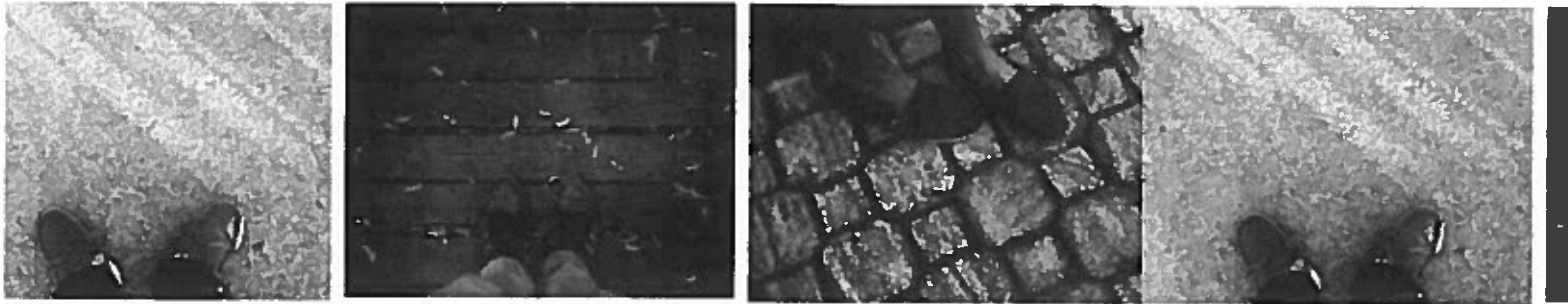

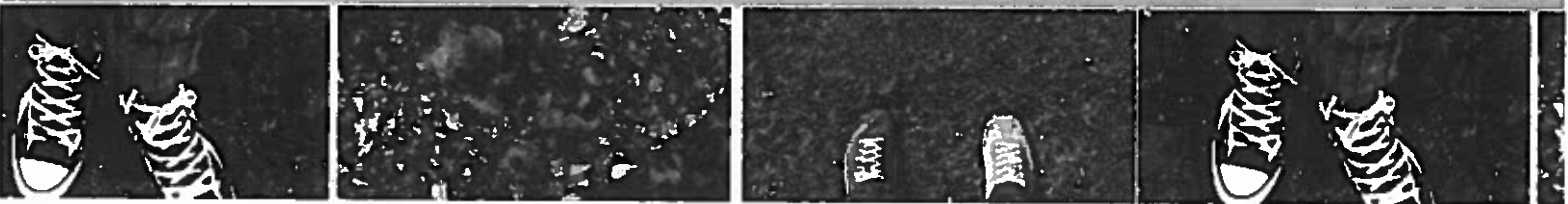

Technology Update – Mrs. Hart!



We have 10 new interactive touch panel Smart Boards at St. John Bosco!

A Smart Board is a monitor that allows you to present lessons in a dynamic and interactive way. Students can interact with a lesson by touching the screen to input information. For example, Mrs. Brauer, our middle school science teacher, can have students “dissect” a frog on the screen without lifting a scalpel. All the “cuts” are done by your finger. Smart Board software allows a laptop to interact with the display and lets the students use the board like a large computer tablet. Smart Board Notebook software has hundreds of interactive lessons available for our teachers. We are very excited about the new opportunities for our staff and students made possible by so many of your generous donations.
