Migrant workers offered food for body, soul

Gillett, Suring Catholics provide 'welcome picnic' to more than 100 laborers

GILLETT — Alicia Garza gets to Mass whenever one is made available to the migrant workers at the Seneca Foods Corporation canning plant.

Garza, who has been coming to Wisconsin to work for 14 seasons from her home in Monterrev. Mexico, said that if a priest is willing to come celebrate Mass, she can make the effort to be part of the celebration.

The mother of three and grandmother of nine, she offered four simple words for her faithfulness: "Because I love Jesus."

Garza was one of more than 100 migrant laborers who took advantage July 21 of what in the past few years has become a tradition, a "welcome picnic" prepared and served by parishioners of St. John the Evangelist, Gillett, and St. Michael, Suring and Chute Pond.

A New Genesis Sr. Marla Clercx, pastoral leader of the Gillett, Suring and Chute Pond parishes, said the welcome picnic "is just a way for us to help the workers know they are an important part of our community. It's also a way

for us to know faces, so when we see them downtown we can interact with them."

The picnic was held under a pavilion near housing on the Seneca campus that the company provides for the majority of the more that 130 migrant workers it employs during the canning season, typically from mid-June

through late September or early October, Food was served from 3 to 6 p.m. so that workers on night shift could have a meal before they began their shift, and those on the day shift could take part as they got off work.

STURGEON BAY --- Fr. Tony Birdsall led with his smile on Aug. 2 as he stepped through the newly opened gate of Corpus Christi Parish's prayer and reflection garden named in his honor.

5 THINGS YOU SHOULD KNOW

Twin saints

Sept. 26 is the feast day of Cosmas and Damian. The two were born in Syria and both became doctors. They were martyred in 287 A.D.

Benedict and Scholastica were frater-2 Benedict and Scholastica were traternal twins. Benedict of Nursia founded the Benedictine order. His sister also led a consecrated life. Tradition says they died about a month apart, in 547 A.D.

While no twin is named, Scripture says St. Thomas was also called Didymus, a Greek name that means "twin."

Crispin and Crispinian were third century martyrs who lived in France. They are patron saints of cobblers.

Gervase and Protase were twin sons of martyrs. They were also martyred together in the second century and are patrons of Milan, Italy.

At a loss this campaign season?

In my conversations with family, friends and colleagues. I find that the vast majority of individuals are at a loss during this presidential campaign season. Many are also tired of the negative rhetoric, and because of it. have decided that they will just "choose the lesser of two evils." Yet, as followers of Jesus devoted to building communities of disciple-

ship, our faith calls us to more than just the "lesser of two evils." Our faith calls us to build God's kingdom of justice, love and peace here on earth, which sounds admirable, but how do we as Catholics do that with two imperfect candidates?

First and foremost, as disciples of Jesus, we must begin with prayer.

Second, remember that "... participation in political life is a moral obligation," (FCFC

13), but that participation requires "a wellformed conscience," (FCFC 17). Forming one's conscience is not something that can be done overnight. It is an on-going lifelong process, and one that each Catholic voter should take seriously. It requires a desire to embrace goodness and truth (because it is God's voice revealing that truth) by studying sacred Scripture and the

teaching of the church, an examination of facts, information and the choices surrounding them and most importantly, prayerful reflection to discern the will of God.

Third, faithful citizenship, like conscience formation, is a year-round effort. This effort is even more important in the coming months ahead because both candidates have stances that are contrary to Catholic moral and social teaching. Therefore, regardless of who wins the election, Catholics will need to actively engage in public life after Nov. 8 in order to discuss our beliefs and values with a legislator who is not intimately familiar with them.

Finally, for more information, I would encourage you to read Forming Consciences for Faithful Citizenship, which was approved by the U.S. Conference of Catholic Bishops in 2015. Faithful Citizenship does not offer direction on how to vote, tell Catholics who to vote for or offer guidance on which candidate or party best reflects the church's moral framework. Instead, it affirms the positive role of the church and Catholics in political life, shares church teaching as a moral framework to help assess issues, political platforms, and campaigns and summarizes church teaching on some of the important issues that face our communities and world today.


