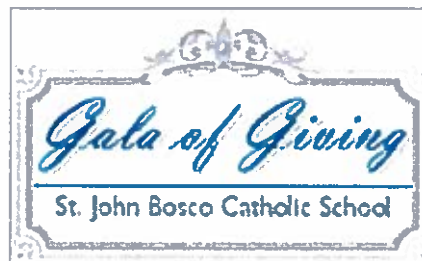

Without a doubt, February has been a busy and exciting month as the details continue to be put in place for our Gala of Giving.
