FROM FR. JOE...

A warm welcome to Bishop LaValley and all the Scouts and their families joining him at the 11:00am Mass this Sunday to conclude the annual diocesan Catholic Scout Retreat! We're so glad to have you with us here!

I find that this harvest season makes for some of the year's best eating...and that's particularly true right here in the parish. Mark your calendar's for the **annual turkey dinner at St. Helen's** next Saturday. Of course, we're looking not only for hungry customers, but also for some willing volunteers--and not just from Chasm Falls, either, but from throughout the whole parish. And a couple of weeks later, back by popular demand, we'll be having a **potluck supper at Holy Family School**. I hope to see many of you at one, the other...or (even better) at both!

Thanks to all who have responded to my lengthy piece in last week's bulletin regarding the changes in the Mass schedule. One further question was raised which has come up before: *Why can't we have a parish-wide survey about this?* One reason is that we've been talking about this for quite a long while already: the first listening session (at which the issue was first publicly raised) was more than a year ago, and it's been four months now since we began specifically asking for your input on the subject--however you wished to share it with us. But another reason is that, with rare exceptions, people will simply "vote" for the Mass time they already attend most often. Such a survey wouldn't really tell us anything we don't already know, or help to move us forward. I know the new schedule doesn't make everybody happy, but neither does the current Mass schedule--even with 6 Masses each weekend. As people did when the Mass schedule changed in 2003 and again in 2007, I'm sure we'll adjust. I promise to keep listening to and considering your concerns...but I need folks to meet me halfway and be patient, understanding, and--most especially--a bit more *flexible* as we try to meet the needs of as many of our parishioners as possible.

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Sister Barbara to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
