FROM FR. JOE...

He just got here...and we're already saying farewell. When **Fr. Justin** arrived in Malone only a year ago, he came with a small gift for the rectory: a statue of St. Alphonsa—a Franciscan nun who, in 2008, was declared India's first native born saint. I must confess that I'd never heard of her before, so I was glad he also brought a little book, which described her as "the smiling saint of India." That seemed so appropriate, since God sent us a *smiling priest* from India! A few months back, one of our parishioners said to me, "I'm so glad Fr. Justin is here; he reminds us that the Church is so much bigger than Malone." Thank you, Fr. Justin, for reminding us—yes, by your smile, but even more, by your priestly ministry—of just how big the Church is, and that God's love is even greater, and that both should be the cause of immense joy in our lives. We congratulate **Brent Charland and Nicholas Haas**—two of our parishioners who, on June 6, were admitted by Bishop LaValley as candidates for ordination to the permanent diaconate in a ceremony at Wadhams Hall in Ogdensburg. Brent and Nick have already been studying for awhile now, and although this makes their preparations quite a bit more "official," they still have a ways to go as they discern the vocation of the permanent deacon. Please keep them (and the other deacon candidates for our diocese) in your prayers.

It's hard to imagine that Wednesday is already the **first anniversary of Foundation Day** for St. André's Parish. (Where does the time go?) We have a little celebration planned to mark this milestone. I hope many of you will come.

At it's meeting last Monday, our **Pastoral Council approved a new Constitution**. (That Constitution will be posted in its entirety on the parish website as soon as it receives final approval from Bishop LaValley). The Malone Catholic Parishes Council was "frozen" by the Bishop two years ago to provide a consistent group to guide the consolidation process here. As our parish approaches it's first anniversary, it's time for a Council that both reflects our new situation and brings in some new perspectives. Four members of the current group will remain (along with the two parish trustees) to provide some continuity, and five new members (including a youth representative) will be elected in just a few weeks. Give some thought and prayer to who you might nominate to serve on the Pastoral Council (the criteria for membership are listed elsewhere in this bulletin)...or even consider nominating yourself! And please join me in thanking those who have served so faithfully during this crucial time in the history of our parish.



**Pastoral Council
Nominations
July 18-19**

St. André's Pastoral Council is seeking nominations for four (4) new adult and one (1) new youth (high school) members. Nominations will be taken up at all Sunday Masses July 18/19. Each registered parishioner will have the opportunity to nominate up to three (3) adults for membership (including himself or herself), as well as one (1) youth member. A ballot will be determined from the nominations received, and elections will then be held at all Sunday Masses July 25/26. According to the Constitution and By-Laws: "Members of the Pastoral Council must be fully initiated members of the Catholic Church—that is, have received the sacraments of Baptism, Confirmation, and Eucharist—who are at least sixteen (16) years of age, in good standing, and are both registered and active in the parish. As a body, they should be broadly representative of the local Catholic community. As individual parishioners, they should be noted for their faith, good morals, and prudent decision-making... The term for each member at large shall be three (3) years, with the exception of the youth member, which shall be one (1) year. Terms begin July 1... Members at large—including the youth member—may choose to serve a second term, but may not serve more than two (2) consecutive terms."

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
