As many of you have most certainly heard, **St. Rita Francis Brady** will be leaving us and her position as librarian at Holy Family School in a few short weeks, having been called back (along with all the other Grey Nuns in the Diocese of Ogdensburg) to live and work at her order's motherhouse near Philadelphia, PA. We're very grateful for all she's contributed to our parish and school over the years. She will be dearly missed! But before she goes, she's celebrating her **60th anniversary as a Grey Nun of the Sacred Heart**. I'm sure you join me in congratulating her on this happy milestone in her life as a consecrated religious. May God bless and guide you always, Sr. Rita Frances!

You might recall that, back in early February, I mentioned a new project in the parish: assembling a team of "parish missionaries" to help reinvigorate the faith in our community through youth and young adult ministry, adult faith formation, parish retreats, and simply by the witness of their faith-filled lives. Over these past six months, many young adults Catholics from across the country (even a few from outside the country) have contacted me about their interest in coming to St. André's to share with others their love for Jesus and his Church. Three young women have been accepted—two have already moved in, and a third arrives on Monday; conversations are ongoing with a few young men. You'll be hearing more about this new venture, and these newly arrived missionaries, in the days ahead. The project is based in the rectory at St. John Bosco Church and is called **Frascati House**, named after Blessed Pier Giorgio Frassati (1901-1925), an athletic Italian layman who dedicated his brief life to prayer, spreading the faith, and serving the poor, and who has become a special patron and model for Catholic young adults. 

## PRECEPTS OF THE CHURCH

1. To attend Mass and rest from servile work on Sundays and holy day of obligation
2. To observe the days of fasting and abstinence from meat established by the Church
3. To confess your sins at least once a year
4. To receive Holy Communion at least once a year, during the Easter season
5. To contribute to the support of the Church according to your ability
6. To obey the laws of the Church concerning marriage

*"What do I need to do to be a good Catholic?" Over the centuries, the Church has developed a trustworthy answer to that question. From the beginning, following Jesus Christ has called for a distinct way of living. Together with the Ten Commandments, the Precepts of the Church (also known as the "Commandments of the Church") represent the necessary minimum required of Catholics to remain in good standing with the Church—which makes them just a starting point, not an end goal. (Keep in mind that they speak only to our external actions, but not our interior motives.) The Church uses these Precepts to remind us that an authentic Christian life demands a certain level of commitment to prayer and participation in the liturgy and sacraments. These Precepts are obligatory; to intentionally violate them without a legitimate reason (for example, sickness preventing someone from attending Mass) is a matter of mortal ("deadly") sin, which cuts off our relationship with Christ and his Church.*
