Why do we use the term “chant” for the music we sing at Mass?

With the publication of the *Roman Missal, Third Edition*, which has been in use since Advent of 2011, we see that all of the singing we use in the liturgy is called “chant.” Many liturgy planning resources also refer to these sung elements as “chant.” The simple reason for using the term “chant” is that it is the term used by the Roman Missal, as well as by some music planning resources, indicating that it is the most correct term to use.

But let’s look a little further... *why* does the Roman Missal use the term “chant”?

The Roman Missal uses the Latin word *cantus* which is translated as “chant” in a broad sense like “song.” It reminds us that the preferred option for singing at the Mass is chant in the narrower sense, “traditional chant,” or “Gregorian chant.” The Roman Missal no longer uses the terms “song” or “hymn” for *cantus* as it did in the second edition.

In its preface, the Vatican II document *Musica Sacram* (“Sacred Music”) makes two interesting and important points:

“(a) By sacred music is understood that which, being created for divine worship, is endowed with a certain holy sincerity of form.” (Cf. *Motu proprio* by St. Pius X).

“(b) The following come under the title of *sacred music* here: Gregorian chant, sacred polyphony in its various forms both ancient and modern, sacred music for the organ and other approved instruments, and sacred popular music, be it liturgical or simply religious.” (Cf. Instruction of the Sacred Congregation of Rites, September 3, 1958, n. 4)
