No matter who you are, where you've come from, or what brings you here, we're so glad to have you with us. St. André Bessette (1845-1937) spent much of his life serving as the door-keeper of his religious community; like him, we strive to open doors for our neighbors to experience the loving mercy of God. May Jesus fill your heart with his grace and peace!

From Fr. Joe...

In recent days, I've come across several **homebound parishioners** who've been unable to come to Mass (some for quite a while) ...but I was only just now hearing about it, and felt pretty bad about that. "We thought you'd already been told, Father..." I think we all know the general principle in life: if you assume that *somebody else* is doing something, the chances are pretty high that *nobody else* will actually do it. And I'm sorry to say, there are simply too many of you for me to be able to keep track of exactly who is in church from week to week. When parishioners fall ill, are admitted to the hospital, or are unable to leave their homes (even if only temporarily), and would like to receive the sacraments, we depend on you—especially their family members—to give us a call so that we can be there for you in your time of need. (We do ask, however, that you do not send us such messages via Facebook or other social media, since they might not be seen in a timely fashion.) In the event of an emergency requiring the *immediate* attention of a priest, and you are at the hospital or the nursing home, simply ask the staff there to page the priest on call—there's one available 24 hours a day.

And if anyone is interested in regularly **bringing Holy Communion to the homebound**, please speak with me or Fr. Scott. There's always a need for more volunteers for this important ministry!

At the annual Chrism Mass back in April, Bishop LaValley announced that the Roman Catholic Diocese of Ogdensburg was entering into a "**twinning**" relationship with the **Maronite Catholic Diocese of Latakia in Syria**. The Christian faith is under harsh attack in the Middle East—in danger of dying out in the very region where it first began. And so our Bishop is calling the people of the North Country into a "solidarity of faith" with our suffering brothers and sisters, out of the belief that we have both much to give and much to receive in such a relationship with a diocese very different from our own. Watch for more information as this initiative takes shape in the months ahead.

Finally, a clarification about the **Pastoral Plan** that was distributed last week. While the plan was passed by our Pastoral Council, it must still be reviewed by the diocesan Living Stones Planning Committee and approved by Bishop LaValley. The dates and details you read in it are not final until that process is complete—and we do not know the timeline for that. I'll be sure to let you know more as soon as I do. In the meantime, if you have questions, please feel free to ask me or any member of the Pastoral Council.

To the parents of young children, may we suggest...

- * Relax! The Lord put the wiggle in children, so don't feel you have to suppress it in his house. All are welcome!
- * Sit toward the front where it is easier for your little ones to see and hear. They tire of looking at the backs of others' heads.
- * Quietly explain the parts and actions of the Mass to them.
- * Sing the hymns, pray and voice the responses. Children learn liturgical behavior by copying you.
- * If you have to leave Mass with your child, feel free to do so... but please come back! As Jesus said: "Let the children come to me" (Mt 19:14).

To the other members of our parish, some reminders...

- * The presence of children is a gift to the Church. They give us "a future full of hope" (Jer 9:11).
- * The way we welcome children directly affects the way they respond to God and to the Church. Let them know that they can be at home here.
- * The parents of young children are doing a great (and sometimes difficult) thing by bringing their kids to Mass. Give them a smile and a word of encouragement!

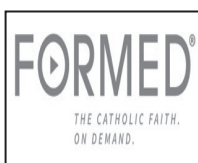

SACRAMENT OF BAPTISM

Parents who wish to have a child baptized should contact Rev. Joseph Giroux to make arrangements for the date and for a program of preparation. Parents are highly encouraged to make arrangements at least three months before the child is born, as the Catholic Church encourages Baptism for infants as soon as possible after birth. Adults and older children (seven years or older) interested in Baptism or entering into full communion with the Catholic Church should inquire about the program of preparation (R.C.I.A.: the Rite of Christian Initiation of Adults).

SACRAMENT OF MATRIMONY

A Catholic wishing to be married in one of our churches should contact one of the priests at least six months prior to the desired date in order to begin making arrangements. A program of preparation is required. The parish should be contacted before any other plans are made—for example, the wedding reception.

SACRAMENT OF THE ANOINTING OF THE SICK

For those preparing for surgery, nursing home residents, or the homebound, contact one of the parish priests to make arrangements to be anointed. For those in the hospital (especially in the event of an emergency), ask the hospital staff to contact the priest on call.
