

Dear Parents,

As part of our school's special social outreach for our 25th anniversary, Annunciation students are being asked to participate in the "Box of Joy" program from Cross Catholic International.

A "Box of Joy" consists of a shoebox filled with small items such as travel size toiletries, school supplies, small toys, and religious articles. These are distributed by Catholic orphanages and mission churches in Third World countries served by Cross Catholic, such as Haiti, Ecuador, Rwanda, and many others.

Our goal is to prepare 10 boxes per homeroom, from Pre-Kindergarten to Grade 8, for a total of 200 boxes for our entire school. Each class will begin collecting **new** items for the boxes and will also accept donations to cover the cost of shipping the boxes. The shipping cost per box is \$9, \$2 of which will purchase grain and rice for every family that receives a box. So, per class, 10 boxes and a total of \$90 for shipping and food.

On the reverse of this letter is the official list of the items that can be included in a Box of Joy. Please note there are some items that cannot be shipped such as liquids, foods, chocolate, and breakable items.

We will kick-off our "Box of Joy" plan on the Monday after Thanksgiving and will run it until Friday, January 12 so that we may complete our collection/packing in time for Catholic Schools Week, January 29-February 2. Students will also watch the Box of Joy video clip from the Cross Catholic website: http://www.crosscatholic.org/boxofjoy. This website has plenty of information about the program which the school will utilize to instruct students about living a life of Christian stewardship and to motivate them to complete the project.

This will be a very special way to celebrate our Catholic school identity by demonstrating to students how we share God's love by our outreach to the less fortunate. Thank you for helping us in our mission to foster the Christian ideal of service.
